Scottish National Standardised Assessments (SNSA)	Every year pupils P1, P4, P7 complete online standardised assessments in literacy and numeracy as part of everyday learning and teaching. The assessments help to identify children's progress, providing diagnostic information to support teachers' professional judgement.
SNSA The Scottish National Sundardised Assessments	Children and young people do not have to revise or prepare for these assessments and there is no pass or fail. The assessments are as inclusive as possible to accommodate the needs of children and young people who require additional support with their learning.
