<u>School Improvement plan priorities for 2017-18</u>
Our three main priorities for the session are:

- Improved performance of all children in Literacy and Numeracy attainment and particularly in identified group of learners.
- Improved Health & Wellbeing for all children with a focus on increased resilience and ability to make good choices.
- Continue to focus on ensuring there is appropriate Pace and Challenge for all learners, leading to increased learner motivation and improved attainment.

We will continue the focus on Literacy throughout the school this session, embedding the initiatives such as Active Literacy in the early years and vocabulary programmes. We have created our Curriculum Rationale and reviewed many aspects of the school curriculum; we will now focus on further curricular areas.

Education Scotland

Our follow-up visit from Education Scotland in March 2017 was very positive and we will now work with Perth & Kinross Council to ensure we continue to strive for excellence in Coupar Angus.
