School meal price

School meal prices increase to £2.15 applicable from 17 April. This increase was approved at the Special Council meeting on 22 February.

This charge applies to nursery, primary 4 to primary 7 and secondary pupils unless registered for <u>free meals</u>.

All primary 1 to primary 3 pupils continue to be entitled to receive the school lunch free of charge.

Please remember you can pay <u>online</u> for school meals via Parent Pay and if you would like some support to set this up, please contact the school office. Many schools are now going cashless and this is something we would like to consider going forward, but all parents need to be registered on Parentpay for this to work.

On Wed 28th March in the afternoon Mrs McLellen will be available to help any parents join Parentpay.

Can you also ensure the office have a note of any changes in email and phone numbers. We will be

sending more and more information through the Parent Pay email in the coming months.

Choosing healthier snacks

The recent Chage4Life Campaign on TV has prompted us all to think about healthier snacking for children. The campaign encourages parents to look for '100 calorie

snacks, two a day max' to help them purchase healthier snacks than the ones they currently buy.

This is because half of children's sugar intake, currently around 7 sugar cubes a day, comes from unhealthy snacks and sugary drinks, which can lead to health problems and dental decay.

Each year children are consuming almost 400 biscuits; more than 120 cakes, buns and pastries; around 100 portions of sweets; nearly 70 of both chocolate bars and ice creams; washed down with over 150 juice drink pouches and cans of fizzy drink.

On average, children are consuming at least 3 unhealthy snacks and sugary drinks a day, with around a third consuming 4 or more. The overall result is that children consume 3 times more sugar than is recommended.

100 calorie znackz zuggeztionz

- Malt loaf slice or mini loaf
- Lower-fat, lower-sugar fromage frais (some flavours include strawberry, raspberry, banana, apricot)
- Fresh or tinned fruit salad
- Chopped vegetables and lower-fat hummus
- Plain rice cakes or crackers with lower-fat cheese
- Sugar-free jelly
- One crumpet
- One scotch pancake

The '100 calorie snacks, two a day max' tip applies to all snacks apart from fruit and vegetables, as children should also be encouraged to eat a variety of these to achieve their 5 A Day.

Remember to always check the label as products may vary.
