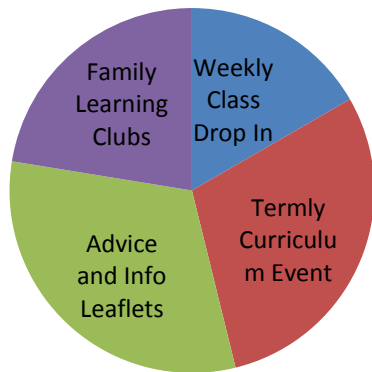


# Coupar Angus Primary School

How would you like to engage further with the school?

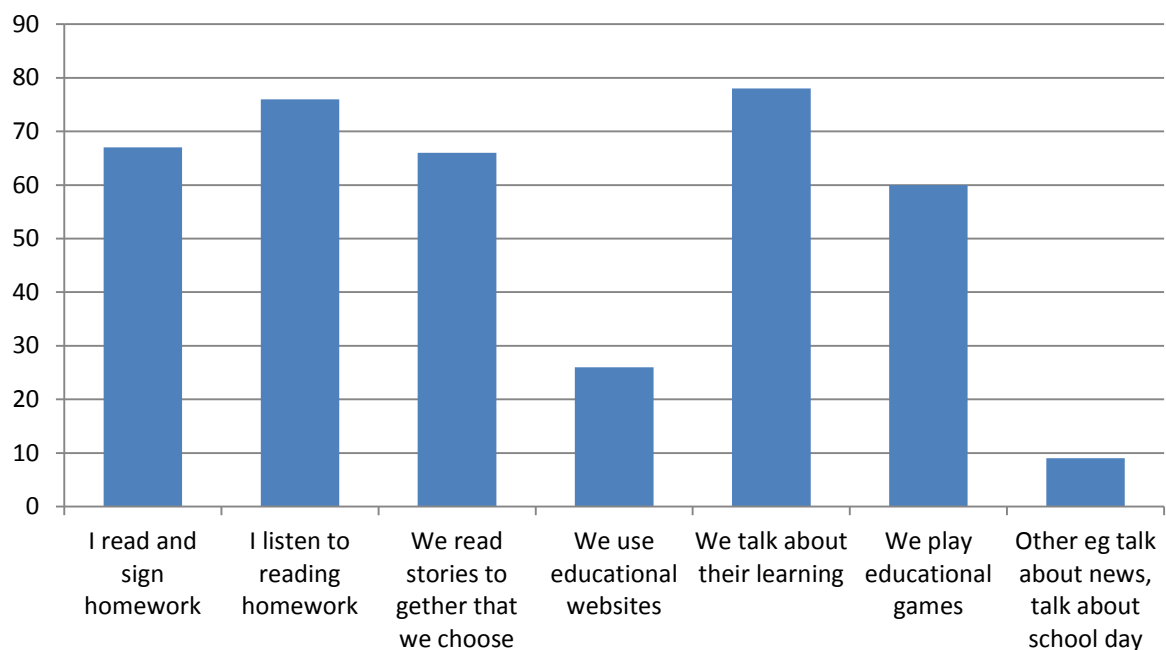


We will continue to have regular curriculum events and endeavour to have these termly. We plan to produce a series of information leaflets for parents and to run workshops on a range of topics such as 'How we teach subtraction' in response to comments. We are starting a Family Club in Term 4 of this session.

Almost all parents commented that they find the school friendly and welcoming. Our recent leak meant that occasionally the front desk was un-manned, happily this has now been rectified.

### Section 2: Learning at Home

Overall parents did not feel that they wanted support with homework. Several parents requested information about how various subjects are taught in order to help with learning at home. We hope that the forthcoming workshops and information leaflets will help with this.

Information about educational websites was requested, we will research this and place links on our school website.

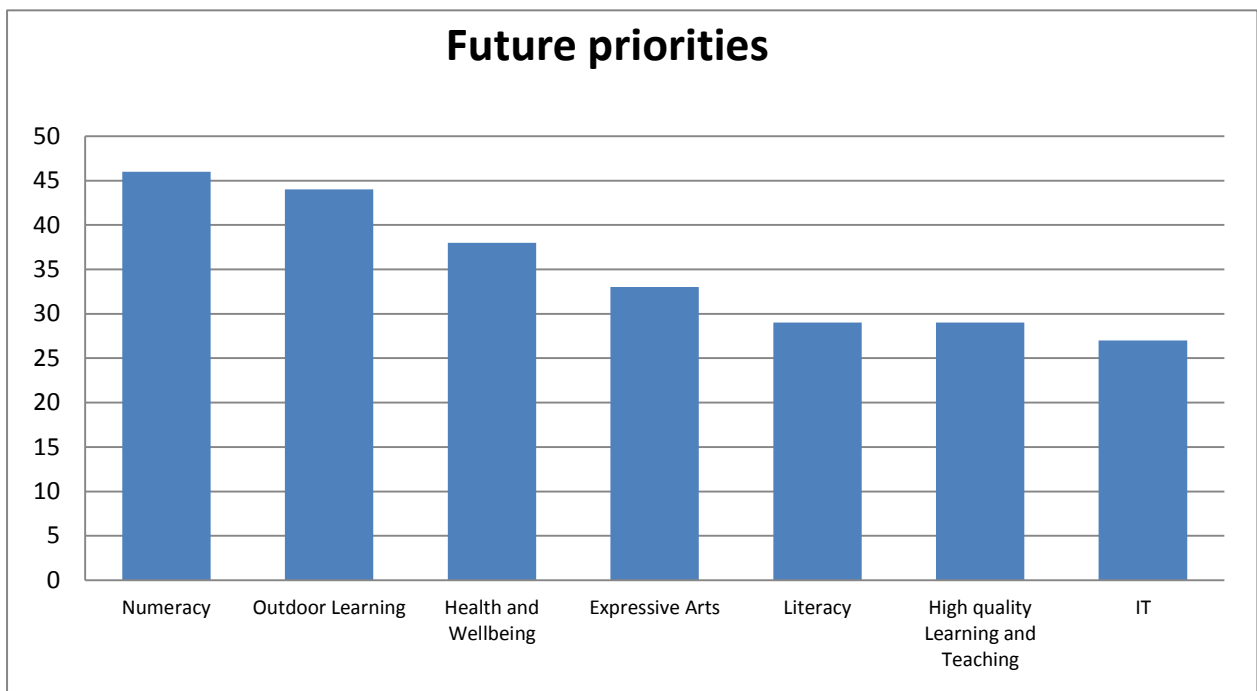
### Section 3: Learning in School

Almost all parents were very satisfied with their child's progress in Numeracy and Literacy. Several parents commented how teaching methods have changed, and again, we hope that our forthcoming Workshops will help parents to feel up to date with teaching methods.

We specifically asked P1-3 Parents about Active Literacy and comments were overwhelmingly positive, particularly from parents who had older children who had not experienced Active Literacy.

The majority of parents felt that pace and challenge of learning is right for their children to make the best progress. A few parents raised concerns about pace being too fast or too slow and this is something that we will continue to evaluate and develop with staff.

### Section 4: Future Priorities



These were the possible future priorities that we had identified as a school. With the high level of agreement from parents, we will take forward Numeracy, Outdoor Learning, Health and Wellbeing and additionally a focus on Music in the next improvement plan. There will always be an ongoing evaluation of Literacy and Teaching and Learning and IT will continue to develop.
