# Welcome to Dunbarney Nursery

Dunbarney Nursery Class opened in 1996 and is an integral part of Dunbarney Primary School. It provides children with their first contact with school and is seen as a key stepping stone towards a successful education. The Nursery serves the Early Years "South Perth Community" with all day sessions during term time (9.00 am - 3.00 pm).

It is well recognised that the earliest years of life are crucial to a child's development and also that family life clearly forms the child. We therefore seek to provide experiences that nurture and support children's learning whilst supporting parents and carers through sharing and receiving information.

**IMPORTANT NOTE!!** Please help us to keep all children safe when they are attending nursery, by <u>always remembering to close the gate</u> behind you at drop-off and pick-up times. The nursery children even completed their own Risk Assessment on this essential safety precaution! Please also remember to close the main school gate behind you, as you enter and leave the school playground, to keep school children safe too. *Thank you everyone!* 

#### Aims of the Nursery

It is during their early years that children start to learn to function as members of a larger social group outside the family. They start to develop the resilience and resources they need to cope with the emotional, physical and intellectual challenges they will meet as they grow. The aims of the nursery are as follows:

- provide a safe and stimulating environment in which children can feel happy and secure
- encourage the emotional, social, physical, creative and intellectual development of children through a broad and balanced curriculum
- promote the welfare of children by creating an environment of trust in which children and their families feel valued and supported
- encourage positive attitudes to self and others, and develop confidence and self esteem in partnership with families and the community
- create opportunities for play with well managed and maintained resources
- encourage independence and foster an enthusiasm for learning.
- provide continuity between children's pre-school and P1 experiences through learning and teaching structures.

#### **Starting Nursery**

Some children may take longer to settle than others so please be prepared to stay with your child until he/she is happy for you to leave.

#### The Nursery Day

Dunbarney offers all day sessions during term time only

Nursery Start Time: 09.00 Nursery Finish Time: 15.00

If you do not want your child to attend for the whole day, we have 2 additional drop off/pick up times.

(Please Note: Lunches in Nursery are provided free of charge)

#### 11.30

Pick up for children who do not require lunch.

Drop Off for children who require lunch and will stay until 15.00.

#### 12.30

Pick up children who have arrived at 9.00 and have had lunch.

Drop Off for children who do not require lunch and will stay until 15.00

Patterns of attendance (other than 09.00 - 15.00) should be agreed in advance with Nursery Staff to avoid the school chasing up unexplained absence. These can be changed periodically.

Please drop off / collect your child promptly. <u>Staff must be notified in advance if anyone other than</u> the regular parent/carer is collecting a child.

#### <u>Attendance – Self-Registration for Children</u>

As you enter the Nursery classroom you will see a board with children's names attached. Please ensure that your child transfers his/her name to the <u>IN</u> position. This board is used for registration and as a check in the event of a fire drill. Likewise, when you are taking your child home, please ensure he/she returns their name to the <u>OUT</u> position.

#### **Absence from Nursery**

Please inform the school office <u>before 9.15am</u> (01738) 474175 if your child is ill or unable to attend. Please let us know if your child's illness is infectious or contagious. If your child has been sick or had diarrhoea, you must allow 48 hours to pass between the last bout of either before your child can return. If you are taking your child on holiday, please notify the office by note or email <u>dunbarney@pkc.gov.uk</u>.

If children become ill whilst at Nursery, we will contact parents/carers immediately. We ask that parents/carers contact the school immediately to inform them of any changes to their phone numbers/address. If parents/carers are unavailable, we will telephone the child's emergency contact – please ensure their details are consistently kept up to date also.

#### **Medicines**

Please let your child's key worker know if your child requires medication whilst at nursery. We can only administer medicine which has been prescribed by a Doctor and still has the prescription on the medicine or packaging. We ask that you fill in medication administration forms which will ask for detailed information regarding dosage and frequency. Only the Centre Leader or Principal Teacher can sign the consent form giving authorisation for the medication to be administered. If your child is taking any medication at home, please your child's key worker as it can affect their behaviour or cause some discomfort e.g. a sore tummy, tiredness etc.

#### **Snack, Lunch and Staying Hydrated!**

Snack is free for all children and is provided mid morning and children are offered a range of healthy foods throughout the nursery week and a choice of milk or water is offered.

Water is continuously available throughout the day and easily accessible to children. We will do our best to encourage children to drink regularly. Children should not bring their own water bottles to Nursery with them to reduce the risk of cross contamination through children drinking from each other's bottles. When children are playing outside for most of the day, we will ensure that children go into Nursery often to get a drink and keep themselves hydrated.

Lunch is provided by Tayside Contracts Lunch and is served in the nursery building.

#### **Clothing & Footwear**

Please send your child to nursery in practical clothes suitable for activities such as painting, playing with water and sand and other types of 'messy play' - although we do our best to provide suitable aprons, accidents can happen. Children will also be involved in a great deal of outdoor play involving physical activities such as running, climbing, pedalling, gardening etc. Children should keep a spare set of clothes in their 'school bag'.

We would also ask that children have a pair of slip-on plimsolls for indoor use on particularly wet days as well as for gym. Lace up shoes, ballet pumps, flip flops etc are not appropriate. We also ask that children keep a pair of suitable outdoor shoes in nursery, preferably Velcro trainers, for outdoor play and for taking part in the 'Dunbarney Dash', which involves children running round the school garden perimeter three times (this is linked to the 'Daily Mile' initiative that is currently being encouraged in nurseries and schools throughout Scotland). Clothing items kept in nursery should be clearly labelled with your child's name. A nursery sweatshirt is available online from border embroideries.

#### **Notice Board**

The notice board in the entrance hall provides parents/carers with current information including weekly plans, snack menus, community information, our current Care Inspectorate report, nursery news and newsletters. Please try to check the notice board as often as you can so as not to miss information and opportunities to assist your child. Your views, comments and suggestions may also be posted here.

#### **The Nursery Curriculum**

Every child in Scotland is entitled to experience a broad general education. This broad education takes place from the early years to the end of S3. To enable this to happen a 'framework for learning and teaching' has been created and this is known as **A Curriculum for Excellence**.


Throughout your child's time in Nursery he/she will be working at the *Early Level* of this curriculum and this will continue into Primary1.

## 'A Curriculum for Excellence'

The learner is at the heart of all that is planned within the Nursery. Children are, even at this early age, encouraged to be confident individuals, effective contributors, successful learners and responsible citizens – qualities that are referred to as 'The 4 Capacities for Learning'.



#### Children demonstrate these capacities by:

being confident in their choices and in their growing friendships 'Confident Individuals'

participating in activities and sharing their news, interests, and knowledge with others *'Effective Contributors'* 

presenting their work in displays, showing development over time 'Successful Learners'

participating in the school's Eco activities, by caring for the Nursery environment and respecting others 'Responsible Citizens'



The nursery is arranged into carefully planned areas, each of which offers a variety of structured play and learning experiences. The children are given a combination of exploratory and directed activities. Children further pursue their own interests through having access to a wide variety of resources.

Through careful observation, staff members identify and encourage children to make full use of the experiences and resources available. After careful observation, staff reflect upon the children's developing skills and interests and this influences planning and management of 'areas of interest' in order to respond to their needs.

#### **Story Corner**

Encourages the development of early literacy through fostering an interest in books, stories, poetry and rhymes. The provision and rotation of good quality books is given high priority. This area is also used to talk to children about the day ahead and share learning intentions.

#### **Languages & Literacy Area**

An area where children can practise 'mark-making' and writing – full of interesting resources that encourage them to put pen to paper, often changing in relation to current interests in nursery.

#### **Mathematics & Numeracy Area**

An area where children can have fun with numbers – full of interesting resources that encourage children to identify, say, write, count and order numbers.

Other resources may include measuring items, pattern making equipment, 2D and 3D shapes etc. Resources available in this area again often change in relation to current interests in nursery

#### **Art and Craft**

Encourages creativity and self-expression through painting, model making, drawing, cutting, sticking, writing and early technological skills.

#### Construction

Large and small construction kits/technical materials develop fine motor skills, problem solving and provide design opportunities.

#### **Creative Play Area**

Stimulates creative play through use of domestic equipment, dressing up, dolls etc.

Areas are changed to follow the children's interests

e.g. shoe shop, office, café, hairdressers, doctors or home area.

#### Sand and Water

Early science concepts will be developed through use of natural materials and specific equipment for investigative and creative play.

#### **Tabletop Games**

A variety of games to encourage early reading and mathematical skills
e.g. memory games, lotto, snap, positions etc.
These help to develop language, general knowledge,
an awareness of early mathematical skills such as colour, shape, sorting etc. and turn taking.

#### **Music and Drama**

There are percussion instruments to play and facilities for listening to music.

Regular listening, rhyming and singing games take place.

Children are encouraged to take part in informal drama activities.

#### ICT

IPads and Ipad software help develop skills and knowledge. ICT activities are planned to support many experiences and outcomes of curriculum for Excellence.

#### **Small World**

Provision of play material such as a doll's house, garage, airport, castle and farm allows adequate opportunity for children to develop imagination and language skills.

#### **Display Tables**

These are arranged to inspire and build on existing interests.

Children are encouraged to bring in any items that would enhance or develop a display.

Displays also provide opportunities for you to help your child contribute to class topics.

#### **Snack Area**

Early maths, reading and social skills are developed at this informal area. Encouragement is given to sample a variety of foods often from other countries but with an emphasis on healthy eating and hygiene.

#### **Outdoor Environment**

Children are outdoors every day where much of the curriculum is integrated into activities.

As well as a fenced tarmac area, we have a nursery garden where children plant seeds, observe bird and insect life etc. There is access to the school garden, adventure trail and football pitch.

Children use a wide range of outdoor equipment. We have weekly use of the school hall to further develop gross motor skills.

#### **Child Protection**

In recent years there has been increased public concern and changes in the law regarding child protection. The Government has made it clear that child protection is everyone's responsibility and that of all workers, including those in school must report concerns about child abuse to a senior member of staff and /or the Social Work Department.

As part of ongoing training all members of staff are aware of the policy guidelines and procedures.

Each school has a trained Child Protection Officer appointed to be responsible for Child Protection matters. In Dunbarney that person is Miss Dow. Should you wish to talk further about Child Protection and the safety of children please do not hesitate to contact Miss Dow directly or through a member of the nursery staff.

We have contact with School Health Nurse and Health Visitors, Doctors, Social Workers and Police, any of whom may become involved if Child Protection concerns are suspected.

If child protection issues arise, the school will ensure that you are informed and participate as appropriate in any action that may be taken regarding your child.


'Getting It Right For Every Child'

#### **Transition to Primary School**

The transition to primary school from nursery is one of the greatest challenges of early childhood – it is a critical time of change for children and their parents, which is full of opportunity and potential. When done well, it can set children into a virtuous cycle of learning and achievement. At Dunbarney Primary School, we want to 'get it right' and to ensure that we do, we plan an effective and supportive transition experience for all of our young and eager learners! It is important for us to forge strong links with other nurseries throughout the pre-school year, hence why we often get together with Doodlebugs Nursery and Bridge of Earn Playgroup and Pre-School and enjoy learning experiences together.



Nursery staff liase closely with the infant department. Information in the form of a Pre-school Report is passed to the school. The information in this record provides the receiving teacher, with details of your child and helps establish their starting point in primary.

Before starting school children have opportunities to visit the Primary 1 classroom, be in the big playground and meet people who will work with them in the Primary Department. Children transferring to other schools have similar arrangements.
