Dear Dunbarney families and friends,

Welcome to our latest newsletter with updates, information, and school dates for your diary.

Staffing Update: We have another retirement announcement to make... we are very sad to say that Mrs S Anderson (Primary Pupil Support Worker) will be leaving us just before the Easter holidays as she takes early-retirement. Mrs Anderson has supported many children over her ten years in post and her contributions to the school and school community have been greatly appreciated, especially by the children. As an important part of our support staff team, Mrs Anderson will be sorely missed; we wish you the very best and thank you from the bottom of our hearts for your years of service.

Mrs Anderson's post will now be advertised on a fixed term basis, internally first and then it moves to external advertising.

Mrs White started her post with us as Primary Pupil Support Worker at the start of term and we are so very pleased to have her here as part of our school staff team; Mrs White is a very busy lady as she already coaches our netball team! Thank you, Mrs White.

Mrs S Law joins our teaching team on a regular basis after having completed a few days of supply work with us. Primary Five were excited to hear that Mrs Law will have regular teaching time in their class and Mrs Law has assured us that the feeling is mutual! Well done P5 and welcome aboard Mrs Law.

Quality Improvement Review & School Visit: On the 26 and 27 February we had a number of our colleagues from our senior education teams visit us in school. They were here to carry out an authority level review of the quality of the care, learning, teaching, assessment, and attainment in our school. Their visit started with a warm welcome and a well organised school tour led by our house captains, Oona, Ruby, Alex and Anna; the visiting team were very impressed by our P7 captains' knowledge of their school as well as their confidence when presenting and guiding them around.

The team carried out a number of classroom visits, met a group of parents, chatted with our support staff team, met with class teachers, took part in a scoping meeting with senior leadership team, worked with groups of learners across the school and analysed our school data and self-evaluation evidence.

At the end of the two days, we all met to receive their feedback and overview, this will be recorded and shared with school in a report. The QIR report is not published but we will share details of this at the Parent Council meeting that follows it.

<u>Seesaw App & Online Learner Profiling:</u> From the 31 May 2024 Perth and Kinross Council schools can no longer use the Seesaw online platform. I'm sharing this date in advance to let you know there will be no online

platform for the month of June 2024. I was hoping that we would be able to share the new platform details with you at this point, however, I am still waiting for the outcome. There will be a decision made centrally in May about what will replace Seesaw and this will then be communicated to us so that we can share the plans with you. During this period, I am hoping that I can have staff trained for the new app and we can begin to prepare and work with you for whatever replaces Seesaw for academic session 24/25.

<u>Homework/Home learning:</u> As we have no online learning platform from 31 May, there will be no homework set this way during the month of June. Each class teacher will prepare a guide for general home learning activities that you may choose to participate in to support your child's learning in June, but the set homework will be limited to reading and any specifically chosen homework as part of some children's personal support plans. The general list will be sent home via the school office.

I apologise for any inconvenience cause by these changes, and we hope to be back up online as soon as we possibly can!

Attendance & Absence


We are aware of an increase in pupil absence from school for a range of reasons. Whilst we totally understand children may have illness and need to have time off, we have a duty to review absence on a termly basis.

You may be sent a letter which identifies the percentage of attendance your child has had and, in some cases, may be asked to come in to discuss this. PKC are tracking attendance and are asking schools to be vigilant for increases in individual absences.

Term time holidays are also impacting on children's attendance and we are aware this can also impact on learners' progress in school. We acknowledge that sometimes term time holidays are cheaper or fit in with working parents but it is worthwhile thinking about what that may affect in terms of learners' confidence and progress in school. 

We always love playing and reading with our Buddies! The Buddies made us little books which we loved. Thank you, Buddies.






Primary 2/3 Class Learning Insight

We are hosting a Plastic Pollution Pick Up in the village which we designed posters to invite our friends and families to come and join us. We have also entered the Marine Art Litter Competition. We had to use recyclable materials to create a piece of artwork to highlight the dangers of plastic pollution.



Primary 4/5 Class Learning Insight


This term P4/5 having been learning about transport and we were very excited to show our learning to our grownups in our Learning Assembly. We hope they 'wheely' enjoyed themselves. We went on a visit to the Dundee Transport Museum where we saw lots of different exhibits and learned a lot about transport and travel in our local area. We created some collaborative dances and have been practising our gymnastic skills. We have been learning about how people put faith into action in their lives and the French vocabulary for places around our school. We have participated in experiments about dissolving and sound. We took part in the Booky and Footy Quiz for World Book Day and our writing has been focusing on letters and organising information in a non-fiction booklet and reports.



Primary 5 Class Learning Insight

P5 have been learning about Natural Disasters. We have learnt about earthquakes and volcanic eruptions being caused by the movement of tectonic plates, the earth's crust. We learnt how earthquakes can be measured using a seismograph and even tried creating one ourselves, using cardboard boxes, a hanging pencil cup and paper. Now we are learning how people predict and prepare for Natural Disasters in the future.

In Maths we have been learning to add, subtract, multiply and divide numbers with a decimal point and have used these skills to solve money, buying and bill paying problems.



Primary 6 Class Learning Insight

This term Primary Six have enjoyed learning about Inspiring People as their context for learning, and one highlight of this has been having the opportunity to research our own inspiring person to create a biography book on them. Researching facts, making notes, and learning how to copy images onto a word document were some of the key skills developed to create our detailed pieces of work – come and take a read of our work which can now be found in our class library!

Our class team participated in the Creative Day of Dance event and shared their brilliant routine 'Eye of the Tiger' based on their own ideas of moves, rhythm and keeping to the beat. We all loved watching your confidence, stage presence and enthusiasm shine through on the stage.

Finally, Primary Six loved coming to school in pyjamas for World Book Day and completing book and writing themed activities linked to making 'Guess my Book' quizzes, our inspiring mathematician Fibonacci and having a go at some Fibonacci Poetry, and to end the day our classroom turned into Starbooks book tasting café. It was enjoyable having a taste of different genres of books and having time to 'sip, taste and read' biographies, poetry, comics, comedy, and fantasy books to name a few. Some of us even found a new book and genre of book to start reading!

Severe Weather

Let's hope our weather is set to improve but we still need to be prepared for the weather changing for the worse and possibly impacting school opening and closing.

Please keep these details somewhere handy for future reference.

Should there be severe weather prior to the start of a school day, our school group call text will contact you, our Dunbarney Parent Council and School Facebook page and our **X** feed will be updated and will intimate any school closure as soon as this information has been decided. In addition to this, information regarding emergency closure due to snow or flooding will also be available from the following sources: (It is important to note that Radio Tay will be used in all instances and that this should be the main source of information. The other information services will only be updated in the event that the severe weather is widespread and is not a localised situation.)

School Closure during the School Day

Should the children already be in school and the weather conditions worsen the school will always remain open. Parents may make the decision to collect their child/ren from school early and should come to the School Office if this is their intention. You are the best judge when deciding whether or not weather conditions are likely to cause difficulty or danger for your children returning home.

In the unusual event of the school having to close during school hours, the school office will communicate this to parents/carers by text, email and our online social media accounts. Parents should then come to the School Office to collect their child/ren. No child will be sent home to an empty house. The school will not close until the last pupil and staff member has left it.

Entrance to School

As with previous years we will have one entrance and exit into the building kept clear during severe weather conditions. Our Janitor will attempt to keep a path along the length of the playground clear but if weather is severe all pupils should enter and exit from the main school reception entrance on the main street. A member of the Senior Management Team will be at this door. **All other gates will be open but paths not cleared.** Please take care if weather is icy as our paths can be extremely slippery.

Parents of nursery children should take extreme care when crossing the playground during icy/severe weather.

Staff Car Park during Periods of Extreme Weather

As at all times of the school year the use of the staff car park for parent parking is not permitted. Snow clearing and emergency vehicles require access at all times. Parents must not park in this area as it is restricted to staff only. Please adhere to these rules to keep all service users safe.

Please note it is permitted for parents and carers to use the car park after school hours (3:45 p.m.) for pick up from clubs etc.

Suitable Clothing

Over the coming months we are unsure how or what the weather may do and would like to take this opportunity to remind all pupils that they should come to school suitably dressed for the weather. The children will have every opportunity to go outside and play but this may be limited depending on the safety of the playground. Playground staff will assess the playground on a daily basis and determine the activities suitable.
