Term 3 has just flown by, with new learning and a range of experiences and opportunities taking place. Learning Journals are regularly updated to share aspects of your child's learning so please do check regularly. Throughout this term, we have been revisiting our school values of trust, teamwork, respect, responsibility and kindness through assemblies and the house points focus. In class, all children have had the opportunity to create a logo/ image to represent each of our values and the Pupil Council are working together to select an image to visually represent each of our values. These will be displayed in our foyer by the front door for all to see! In Nursery, the children have been learning about our values too. They have created a super wall display to add to as the children demonstrate these values.

## P1 News


"This term, Primary One have been exploring forces and motion, learning how objects move and interact. They've had fun with 2D and 3D shapes after working hard to learn to tell o'clock times. Through Emotion Works they've discovered new words to express feelings. Additionally, they've been introduced to French, learning basic greetings and vocabulary with Giraffe!

Primary one said that this term they are best at "teamwork and being friends and helping each other and being kind."



## P2/3 News

P2/3 have been learning about Changing Landscapes and have been focussing on the development of the new Destiny Bridge. We have learned about different types of bridges and the best shape to make a strong bridge. We made models using spaghetti and marshmallows, cocktail sticks and marshmallows as well as a range of construction materials.



## P4/5 News

What an impressive term of progress, with hard work paying off in our learning.

In literacy, we have mastered VCOP, and our reading has improved with progress in test results. In numeracy, we've tackled multiplication, division and word problems with a growth mindset. In HWB we explored how cogs work, like in a WW2 watch, to understand Emotion Works.

We loved solving mysteries, particularly revealing the culprits who stole our blue items! Also, we enjoyed playing glockenspiels, celebrating World Book Day in pyjamas, and performing impressive Scottish poetry—who knew a frog could be so popular?


We excitedly watched natural disasters appear on Newsround and now can't wait for our class trip next term!



## P5/6 News

In P5/6 with Miss Fidler the children have enjoyed sharing their views and working together to rearrange the classroom. The morning Smart Start has been very popular with a range of creative activities to develop perseverance, focus and fine motor skills.

Number work has been a focus: multiplying, dividing, decimals and fractions. In maths, the class have developed their understanding of direction and directional language including degree turns clockwise and anti-clockwise. In literacy, P5/6 have worked on using a range of openers in their writing and using speech marks. They will continue to work on paragraphing and using more ambitious vocabulary.



## P6/7 News

This term, we have explored forces and friction through the magical world of *Harry Potter*. We have investigated push and pull forces, experimented with how surfaces affect movement, and learnt about gravity using broomstick-themed activities. Through hands-on science experiments, creative writing, and role-play, we have deepened our understanding of motion and resistance. We have also developed our measuring and recording skills, linked science to literacy and art, and reflected on how forces shape both the magical and real world.



### Cross Country Championships

The annual Perth & Kinross Schools Cross Country Championships event was held at Perth Racecourse on **Tuesday 25 March 2025**. Many P6 and P7 pupils took part in an 8.15am training club to prepare for the race. A group were selected to represent the school at the event and they did very well, putting all of their hard work into practice. Well done to all of our runners! Thank you to Mrs Harrow for running the club and to the parent helpers for transporting our runners to the event.
