

Core Learning

Literacy & Language

- Use notes and other types of writing to help understand information and ideas, explore problems, make decisions, generate and develop ideas or create new text.
- Develop handwriting skills that can be transferred across areas.
- By considering the type of text I am creating, I can select ideas and relevant information, organise these in an appropriate way for my purpose and use suitable vocabulary for my audience
- I can discuss, debate and improve my ideas with increasing confidence and clear explanations.
- I am learning to use language and style in a way which engages and / or influences my reader.
- As I listen or watch, I can identify and discuss the purpose, main ideas and supporting detail contained within the text, and use this information for different purposes.

Numeracy & Maths

- Developing understanding of money by budgeting, comparing costs and using problem solving skills to make informed financial decisions in real-life situations.
- I can investigate the everyday contexts in which simple fractions, percentages or decimal fractions are used and can carry out the necessary calculations to solve related problems.
- I can conduct simple experiments involving chance and communicate my predictions and findings using the vocabulary of probability.
- I understand squared, cubed, powers and roots of numbers.

Health & Wellbeing

- Investigate a range of foods available during World War II and how families made meals with limited supplies.
- Use emotion cards to discuss various scenarios in real life.
