(e.g. chalk, paint, pens, on someone's back with your finger, on the side of your bath with your fingers).</p> | <p>Practise initial sounds Pick a sound and go round your house finding things that start with that sound.</p> <p>Play iSpy with someone at home.</p> | <p>Listen to a story. Draw a picture about the story.</p> <p>Early level English and Literacy - BBC Bitesize</p> | <p>Name Art Write your name in big letters and decorate it with colours, stickers or other materials you have at home.</p> |

| <p>Think of something kind you have done today. Talk about a random act of kindness you would like to do at home!</p> | <p>Go on a winter walk with your family. Can you draw a picture of the signs of winter you spotted?</p> | | <p>Help at home with the cooking. Remember to wash your hands and follow all instructions given by the adult.</p> | <p>Movement Challenge Create a short exercise routine (e.g. 5 star jumps, 3 hops, 2 spins). Teach it to someone at home.</p> |
| <p>Take part in learning with Dug's Discovery Den. There are stories, songs and things to create.</p> <p>Early Years & P1 e-Sgoil</p> | <p>Share on Learning Journals some photographs of the day you have had with your family where you are learning something new.</p> | | <p>Read a book together, look at the pictures and talk about it with your friends and family.
