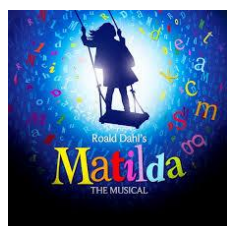
House Winners

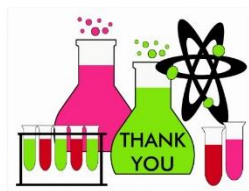


Drugs Talk

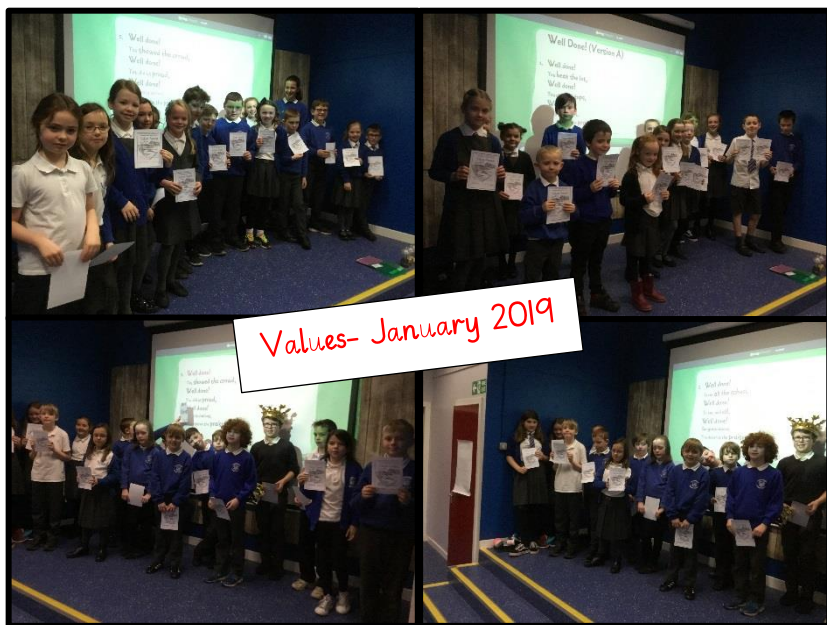
