Improvement planning

On an annual basis, every school in Scotland draws up an improvement plan for the forthcoming school session to set out its targets and priorities. Johnstone High is no different, and our improvement plan for 2018/19 will be put on our school website once it has been approved by the local authority.

As a result of our successful Education Scotland continuing engagement visit in February/March 2018, next session our improvement plan will see us continue to embed our two key priorities of 'health and wellbeing' and 'learning and teaching'. The inspectors liked what we were doing and agreed that as we were at a relatively early stage in our improvement journey, we should keep going in these areas in order to see significant impact on outcomes for our young people. Therefore, alongside nurture, a key focus for us next session will be supporting young people with mental health issues and further developing our ability to support youngsters who have 'adverse childhood experiences' (ACES) such as a bereavement.

To draw up the 2018/19 improvement plan we consulted with the full range of stakeholders in our school – parent and pupil council representatives via focus groups, a drop-in evening open to all parents (in the letter I sent home on 5th June), staff drop-in sessions, meetings with promoted members of staff, and discussions with friends of the school (e.g. Skills Development Scotland, Community Learning and Development, Home Link etc). My thanks to everyone who contributed to ensure our plan is genuinely 'owned' by the wider JHS school community.

In addition to the school improvement plan, this year we have drawn up a 'standards and qualities' leaflet for parents. This provides a snapshot of our school – successes, achievements and next steps. This too will be placed on the school website, and if any parent would like a 'hard copy' of this or the school improvement plan, please contact the school office.

School Uniform

Every July and August the shops are full of young people and parents embarking on the dreaded 'school uniform' shopping expedition. I thought it might be helpful to parents to give you a summary of what the expected school uniform is:

Acceptable, encouraged school uniform

- School shirt and tie
- Black jumper / cardigan
- Black trousers/ skirt
- Black shoes
- · Many pupils wear a blazer
- PE kit black/navy bottoms

Not acceptable

- branded PE top or white t-shirt
- No tie
- Hoodies / branded tops
- Jeans / leggings / grey trousers
- Coloured trainers
- · Denim jackets
- Items deemed inappropriate (e.g. football colours)

I would really appreciate parental support with this.

Finally, please note that uniform does not need to be branded or from specialist providers; more affordable versions from high street shops or supermarkets are absolutely fine for school. Thank you!

Free School Meals and Clothing Grants

To apply for free school meals and / or a footwear and clothing grant please access Renfrewshire Council's website and type in 'free school meals' and 'clothing grants' in the search bar. The application forms and guidance can be found there. Alternatively, you can get a paper copy from all Renfrewshire schools and from council customer service centres. The paper forms should be available from mid-June 2018.

When you download the form, you will need to print out a blank copy, fill it in and sign it, and return it to the address below:

Free School Meals/Clothing Grant Application

The level of clothing grant is £100 per eligible pupil.

If you received free school meals or a clothing grant last session (2017-2018), you should receive a letter to your home address. If there are no changes to your circumstances, complete the declaration form with the letter, and return it to the council. If you have had a change of circumstances, or if you are applying for the first time, please complete the application form. You must include the supporting evidence asked for on the form. If you have not received your clothing grant cheque three weeks after submitting your application, phone the council on: 0300 300 0300.

School Transport

To apply for school transport please access Renfrewshire Council's website and type 'school transport' in the search bar. The application form and guidance can be found there.

Home to school transport will be provided if your child:

- lives more than two miles away from his or her local secondary school by the shortest safe walking route
- has been recommended on health grounds by a designated medical officer
- has been assessed to attend a school to meet the requirements of his or her additional support needs. (These assessments involve psychological services, who also recommend appropriate transport arrangements.)
- has to walk a route which, after seeking advice, is considered by Children's Services to be unsafe for children when accompanied by a responsible adult.

If your child is going to secondary school you should apply in the February of the last year at primary school. You can apply at a later time but there could be a delay while arrangements are being made. If you move house at any time during the year, you can apply or reapply for home to school transport

Privilege passes

Privilege passes may be available if there are vacant places on dedicated school transport vehicles. The availability of privilege passes will be assessed after places for entitled pupils have been allocated. Privilege pass applications, for the start of the new school year, should be submitted by the first day of term and allocations will take place in September / October. Where there are insufficient spaces available for all privilege pass applications a ballot procedure will be followed. Your application will remain on a waiting list for consideration should subsequent spaces become available at a later date.

The aim is to build a link between the S1 pupils and the staff and hopefully the first years feel they have someone they can go to in the first instance if they are worried about anything.

Nuclear Power Station Trip

n a cold and windy couple of days at the start of May S3 pupils from Johnstone High School had the opportunity to visit the Hunterston B power station on the Firth of Clyde coast. Hunterston is one of only 2 Nuclear power facilities in Scotland operated and run by the French government company EDF. Pupils had the chance to see a presentation from facility staff members about the working environment at the plant as well as some safety features and precautions. Pupils then took part in a guided tour of the facility taking in the main turbine rooms and control rooms before having a

chance to try out some virtual reality in the activity hub.
Hunterston B is due to be decommissioned in the next 4

years but the breakdown of the site is currently estimated to take 100 years.




