


# Message from the Head Teacher



# **Children's Rights**



As a Gold Rights Respecting School, our children are currently thinking about children's rights. A charter is a visual document that establishes an agreed set of rights-based principles upon which relationships can be based and which provide a language for shared values. Creating charters can support a positive learning environment for children and young people in the classroom, across the whole school, in the playground or other areas within the school. Creating a charter helps to make the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC) more prominent and relevant. It is a framework for both adults and children on how to respect each other's rights. A charter not only provides an opportunity to learn about specific articles from the CRC but helps to establish and build shared values and relationships for creating a rights respecting ethos. The process of developing a charter models a rights respecting way of working in school. We will post pictures of our new charters on X once they have been created and you will get a chance to see them at our Meet the Teacher Sessions.

# **Learning and Teaching**

This session as part of our school improvement plan, we will be reflecting on what good learning and teaching looks like in Arkleston. We started this process in June, when we consulted with children during our committee (Pupil Voice) time. We asked them to tell us what makes a good teacher and what makes a good lesson?



As a staff team, we will be using our collegiate time to reflect on what the children have said and to think about our practices. This will help us to ensure that the experiences in our classrooms support all children to achieve success. If there is anything that you wish to add to what the children have said, please message me on SEESAW. We have started this process by focussing on building strong relationships in our new classes and with our new members of staff. Children have all settled in well and are learning how to manage themselves and their resources, to be ready to learn.


# **Achieving Citizens – Reading Schools**

Last session, we began our Reading Schools journey and Miss Clark worked with a committee of children to reflect on our approaches to reading for pleasure across the school. Trying to build and sustain a reading culture is not easy, but one of the first things that Miss Clark organised, was a trip to the library for every base. This became a regular feature throughout the session, with children borrowing books, listening to authors and taking part in a variety of activities to promote and encourage a love of reading. This was only part of the committees work, but we are delighted to announce that due to their hard work and commitment, the school has now been awarded our Core Reading Schools Accreditation and we will now be working towards our Silver.

Research proves that reading for pleasure is central in supporting equity and wellbeing, positively impacting learners' attainment across the curriculum, critical thinking, creativity, empathy and resilience. We would hope that every child was able to make good use of the local library in Renfrew. If your child does not yet have their own library ticket, please pop down to the library and fill out an application form.

We look forward to developing our school libraries this session, with the help of the parent council, ensuring they are inspiring places to encourage good reading habits.

We continue to think about how we can promote healthy and active lifestyles at Arkleston and are delighted that we can now resume PE lessons in the gym hall. Children are advised to wear their PE kit on their PE days or to wear it under their clothing. Classes will also have outdoor PE and children should ensure that they have a waterproof jacket with a hood to ensure they can participate, regardless of the weather. Children should not wear jewellery on a PE day and earrings must be removed or covered.

Many classes are continuing to participate in The Daily Mile. This is no more than 15 mins of jogging/running - at a pupil's own pace - around the track we had drawn a few years ago. The daily mile is designed to improve levels of fitness in children and to provide that brain break that is sometimes required. 

# **Pupil Information / Attendance**

The annual data check forms have been sent home. We would appreciate it if you complete these and return as soon as possible. It is important that we have the most current and up to date information about each child on our system in case of an emergency. If your details change over the course of the session, please let the school know.

We appreciate that sometimes parents have to make last minute changes to their child's arrangements at the end of the day. Please contact the school as early as nossible if this is the case

If your child is going to be absent from school for any reason, please contact the school to ensure that the registers have the correct information. Safe and well text alerts will be made to the parents/carers of any child marked absent on the register after 9.15am. If you receive a message, please contact the school.

As we have a staggered entry at the moment, there is flexibility between 08:55 and 09:00. If your child arrives once the doors are shut, they should report to the office before going to class. Attendance is monitored regularly and where a child's attendance/late coming is becoming a concern, we will contact you to discuss the reasons. Attendance is monitored at the end of each session and you may receive a letter from us noting any concerns for your records.

# **Drop Off**

As part of our authority Travel Plan and to ensure your child's safe arrival at school, we would ask that children should be dropped off at the main gates of the school or Tesco car park and not in the driveway/car park. Only parents with a parking permit will be allowed access to the grounds. These are given on an individual basis after discussion with the head teacher. Parents requiring a disabled parking space will find two within school grounds. Please do not park in these unless you are displaying your blue badge.

# **Medicines**

If your child requires medication during the school day, please complete a permission slip at the office. All medicines must be handed into the office and refreshed regularly where appropriate. Medicine can only be given when prescribed by a doctor or pharmacist. The box must have the pharmacy label on it with dosage information. We cannot administer over the counter medication to children during the day. Children can have their inhalers in their school bags if they are old enough to manage the administration of their medication.

# **Water Bottles**

Please make sure your child has a water bottle with them. They can drink still water throughout the day, which can be topped up at our water courses.

### **Label Clothing**

Please make sure that every item your child brings to school is labelled to ensure its safe return if lost. We already have some unclaimed lost property items.





# What have we been up to?



### Base 2 -

Primary 1 - What a busy start to our year in Primary 1! Our newest Arky Stars have already settled into life at Arkleston and have been starting to learn all the daily routines and procedures that we need to follow. We are becoming very good at making our lunch choices and indicating how we are feeling when we arrive at school. We have been learning to use a task board to complete our daily jobs. Play is how we learn and permeates all areas of learning in Base 2. We have opportunities to play in the classroom every single day, and often we will go out to visit Beastie Street and experience outdoor learning. Through play we are developing lots of skills such as problem solving, cooperation, and risk taking. In Literacy this term, we will be learning all about rhyme and identifying our initial sounds. We will be able to recognise, say, and write the alphabet sounds, and we will soon begin to blend sounds together to read CVC words. We have started learning some tricky words, too. We need to pratise these at home to help us with instant recognition of these words, which will support our reading. As we learn our tricky words and build confidence sounding out, we will start to read books in school, and these will eventually be sent home in our blue bags to read at home. We have started learning to retell and innovate stories using the Talk4Writing programme which we are really enjoying! We are learning to hold our pen/pencil correctly and add lots of detail to black pen drawings for Foundations of Writing. In Numeracy and Mathematics, we are learning about number to 10 and beyond. We are enjoying exploring numbers by being able to count forwards and backwards, order and sequence the numerals, show 1-1 correspondence when counting, and correctly form our numerals. We participate in SEAL activities at the Teacher Table individually or in small groups. This term we are looking at pattern and are having lots of fun continuing and creating patterns using a variety of objects/colours/shapes. We will also be finding out about 3d shapes and their properties, and different types of data that we can gather and display.



### Base 3

Primary 2 - We have had a busy start to Primary 2, settling in to a new classroom and new routines. This includes a new morning task, helping us to become more independent learners. In Literacy, we are continuing to learn new sounds and tricky words, as well as completing a spelling test on Fridays. We are enjoying our Talk For Writing and are focussing on The Three Little Pigs, including character descriptions and innovation of the story to make our own version. Reading continues to be a key focus of our learning, and we are completing a daily reading challenge with our friends. We hope to be the best readers in the school this session! In Numeracy, we have been revisiting numbers 1-30, including recall, sequencing and ordering. We are looking at place value, and new strategies for improving our addition and subtraction. Through active maths, we are exploring the two times table. We are having great fun with our learning. To assist us in using our problem-solving skills and to enhance our design skills, we will be starting den building. Teamwork is important to the ethos of Base 3. We will be looking at 'Our Community' this term, finding out about local landmarks, the history of Renfrew and keeping safe in our community. In the run up to Harvest, we will be looking at the importance of local agriculture and food production and are excited to start practising for our Harvest Assembly.

**Base 4 -** A very warm welcome from Primary 3 and Primary 4. The children are settling well into their new class. We are enjoying sharing our base. As a base, we have decided to have a bee theme for the class charter. It already looks very busy, just like our year ahead.

**Primary 3** We are looking forward to learning about number processes, place value and addition and subtraction during our numeracy lessons. In addition, we will continually practise our times tables. During literacy, the children will

create a report about an alien landing in Arkleston Primary School as well as weekly spelling and reading challenges. Our current class novel is Alfie Onion. Our base topic will be about being respectful and responsible in Renfrew and what citizen in the community can help us to understand these values better.

### Primary 4

Within numeracy this term, we are learning about place value and a digit's position up to 1000, number processes, addition, and subtraction, alongside consolidating and learning new times tables. In literacy, we have started reading our new class novel, The Adventures of Alfie Onion. The children are excited to engage and learn about the adventure of Magnifico and his brother, Alfie Onion. Reading will be a key focus this year as we develop our reading and comprehension skills. In primary 4, we are continuing to learn new sounds and common words and we will complete a spelling test every Friday. We have started our Talk for Writing text 'Amazing Aliens' and look forward to developing our writing this year. During this term, we will be learning about ways to be respectful and responsible in our community Renfrew and citizens that can help support us in doing so.



# What have we been up to?


**Base 5 -** Primary 5 and Primary 5/4 have settled well into our new class! We are very lucky to be working all together in Base 5. It has been a busy few week! We have decided on a Lego themed class charter and the children have been busy creating their own Lego themed characters.

We have been enjoying reading Roald Dahl's 'The Witches' as our class novel. We have been creating our own potions and have taken our learning outside to design witches lairs in our learning groups. In Talk for Writing we will be focusing on non-fiction and creating persuasive writing based on our model text Amazing Aliens. Our topic this term is Water in our World. We are investigating the health of our school pond, finding out about plant and animal life in the Clyde and looking at how climate change is affecting seas and oceans around the world. We will also learn about the River Clyde past and present and how it has shaped life in Renfrew. In Maths, we have been extending our knowledge about place value and rounding to the nearest ten and hundred. We are also conducting some surveys and using our results to create bar charts. At home, we will be practising our multiplication tables to help us with our Big Maths Beat That Challenges. We will also be visiting the library in Renfrew soon to choose some books.

Base 6 – We have been 'The Outlaw Varjak Paw' and we are enjoying reading it so far. It's a very good book, very interesting and we have enjoyed predicting what might happen next to Varjak and his friends. We have started looking at natural disasters as our Respected and Responsible Citizens topic and are working on some research to present to the class. Each group is researching a different disaster. Our talk for writing block this term is a news articles and we have begun learning our model text with the actions. The next task is to create our own text maps. One of the first things we tackled was our class charter. We voted on a Mario theme and have linked the rights to being strong and working as part of a team. In numeracy, we are learning about place value, rounding and estimating. We have enjoyed learning about the different types of rock which make up the earth in science and developing our skills in possession games and athletics in P.E. It has been a busy but enjoyable start to the year and we are looking forward to seeing what the rest of the term holds! We were lucky enough to have a training session with St Mirren Football Club, who will soon be offering an after-school club at Arkleston.



Base 7 We have enjoyed using Lego to express our interests in learning. We built Lego to show our hidden talents and what we had achieved within the last 12 months. We then shared this amongst our peers. We have started our class novel Divided City which has been exciting because we can talk about different football teams and are learning about discrimination and inclusion. Our number knowledge has been challenged by learning about rounding. We have learned to be a role model for the primary 1s and across the school by setting an example during assembly and whenever we are moving around the school. We cannot wait to head to Ardentinny this term where we will do different team building games and challenge ourselves by doing different activities!


