# Message from the Head Teacher

With the clocks having gone back, we are in a period of change, with the leaves changing colour and falling off the trees and the nights getting darker earlier. We discussed at assembly that change happens in nature all the time and indicates periods of time. Sometimes we can predict changes that will happen in our lives and have some degree of control over it. Congratulations to the families who have recently welcomed new additions into their homes and to those off on new adventures, moving to the other side of the world. These changes will certainly have an impact on families in a positive way. Some changes have an impact on families in a less positive way, when parents separate, or families experience bereavement. These changes can often be unexpected, and we can have little control over them. The one thing we know for sure is that change links to emotions.

It can be tricky to manage our emotions when change happens and our emotions can be overwhelming. As adults we have the difficult job of trying to shield our children from the emotions associated with change. We don't want them to carry grown-up worries, but we know that our children care deeply for the adults in their lives, so we must be sensitive when supporting our children. This will include being discreet when monitoring how a child presents in school. What we hope is that school can be a safe space where they can let go of their worries and focus on their learning and relaxing and having fun with friends. We monitor their emotion stars booklets daily and look for patterns that suggest they are struggling emotionally, so that we can discuss with you, how best to offer support.

Please let us know if there are any changes to your family circumstances that you feel may impact your child. The more we know that more support we can offer. This links with our vision of, 'The more we learn, the brighter we shine.'

There are many occasions where your child may feel unsafe because of their own actions or the actions of others. Over their years in Arkleston we hope to empower them with the skills and knowledge to use their character strengths to make wise choices, use caution and control when faced with any sort of danger. We are also aware that recently within our own community there has been an increase in violent and aggressive behaviours leading to some very sad outcomes for citizens of Renfrew.

# **Being Safe in my Community**

Primary one have been learning about the people who can help them in their community when they are faced with danger.



The children were lucky to receive a visit from the local fire brigade, who showed the children their equipment and they even got to use the hose. We are fortunate to have the fire station located close to the school and the children took some time to find out where the station is on walk to the local library.

### Safe Citizens

Article 38 of the UNCRC states that children should be protected during a war. We want Arkleston to be a safe place for our children.

We know that the war in Ukraine continues and that many of our families are affected. There is also another war in Gaza, affecting many children. Wars over the generations have been fought to ensure the safety of countries and their citizens.

Every year on November 11<sup>th</sup>, we remember those who have fought for their country and those who have died or been injured in war. Our P7 pupils have been selling poppies to the children in the school. For a donation of e.g. 50p children can buy a poppy to wear in remembrance of those who have kept us safe over the years. Thank you to them all.



#### Safe Citizens

Some P7 children had a great time recently at Ardentinny residential centre and they had to make good use of their character strengths whilst there to keep themselves safe. When trying new activities, it is important to manage the risks surrounding them and at the centre the children were briefed by the instructors on what to do and how to do it to ensure their safety and the safety of others.





Children had to use caution, be brave and wait whilst participating in the gorge walk. Whilst out on the water, they had to work as part of a team and try.



Using the strengths of brave, try, be wise and learn to scale the rockface.



Children also use these character strengths when working outside to ensure their play is safe. P6 children designed obstacle courses that P1 safety tested. They used the strengths of create, team and learn to design their courses using our den building materials. P1 had to use their strengths of wait, use caution, use control and be wise to navigate the course.

Many activities have required our children to think about being safe citizens of Renfrew. Walking to the library, every class has had to consider the safest route and reflect on safe actions whilst out with their class. By being safe citizens, the children were able to enjoy their visit.



We hope that children will develop skills now that will help them as they become more independent within their community.

# What have we been up to?

**Base 2** – In **Primary 1**, In Literacy this term, we will be continuing to work hard on learning our single sounds and tricky words, as well as blending to read CVC words. We will all have a go at reading books with our teachers, and some of us are working on reading a sentence by ourselves. We will continue to find and generate words that rhyme, as well as finding alliteration – words that start with the same initial sound. In Writing, we are focussing on letter formation this term and so we will be working hard to form our sounds correctly. We will also be trying hard to write a sentence with a capital letter, full stop, and finger spaces, with or without support. In Talk4Writing, we are currently learning the story of *The Little Red Hen* using our story map to help us. We will begin to innovate this shortly. In Numeracy and Mathematics, we will be looking at the concept of addition. We will discover and explore how to calculate how many altogether with

two or more groups of objects. We will then formalise this by learning the vocabulary associated with addition, as well as how to show written calculations and learning some number bonds. We will explore several mathematics topics this term, including money, measure, and symmetry. We will be finding out what coins we have in Britain and be able to identify and sort these. We will then work on money amounts using coins. For measure, we will be using lots of different vocabulary to describe length, volume, and mass, and we will use these words to compare objects. We will measure items using non-standard units. We will also be working hard on our singing and acting skills in order to present our Nativity in December. Prior to this we will be learning about the story of the Nativity, and how Christians celebrate Christmas. We will also look at celebrations in other religions. We will enjoy some science this term; experimenting with solids, liquids, and gasses, as well as exploring light and dark in relation to the changing season and being safe. A very busy term indeed!

**Base 3** We have hit the ground running in Term 2 by starting a new Talk for Writing unit with the story of 'Little Charlie and the Lighthouse Keeper'. We can't wait to share our next video of the children retelling the story from their story maps! We have continued with our daily reading challenge to improve our fluency in reading and to apply our reading strategies such as Sharp Eye and Mouse the Mouth. We are learning new diagraphs in literacy which is helping us extend our vocabulary and assist with our reading. In numeracy, we are focusing on measurement and a range of addition strategies. At present, we are focusing on the counting on strategy to assist us to complete addition calculations. We are exploring maths stations and enjoying active maths! We have been learning about how Halloween is celebrated around the world and learning to be safe around fireworks. Our topic this term is focusing on the novel of *The Snowman* by Michael Morpurgo, which is



inspired by the original story by Raymond Briggs. In addition, our enterprising young learners will be creating Christmas crafts for the school fayre and learning about Fairtrade.

**Base 4 - Primary 3** It has been an encouraging start to this term with lots of very happy children enjoying being back at school. We have been learning about water safety around Renfrew and beyond. We will also be explore housing in Renfrew pre and post war and the reasons why housing has changed so significantly. Children will be exploring number processes, using their knowledge of times tables for multiplication and division. In addition, we will be learning about the general concepts of time. We will continue to develop our writing skills using Talk for Writing. This term we will be learning about trolls. The children will then create a fact file.

P3 will be increasing their fitness levels during P.E. P3 will continue to have P.E on a Tuesday and a Thursday. Can you ensure children either remove jewellery or use tape to cover it up. Homework will be active on a Monday at 3.15pm. Homework jotters and reading books should be returned on a Monday morning. This will help us to prepare for the week ahead. We all have much to celebrate with Christmas quickly approaching. We are looking forward to preparing for the Nativity. Please ensure you have labelled your child's uniform. It is far easier to find the owners and return items quickly if they are labelled. We would also like to take this opportunity to say a sincere thank you for your overwhelming support last term. We couldn't do it without you.

**Primary 4** - We have had a busy and exciting first term learning in Primary 4 and have had an enjoyable first few weeks in term 2. In Literacy this term, we have been developing our writing and learning to write persuasively. We have started our new Talk for Writing unit with our new story 'The Truth about Trolls' and have enjoyed reciting our text maps and learning our actions. We are continuing to learn our new sounds each week alongside common and tricky words, engaging in various active spelling activities to learn our new spelling words. We have continued to make reading a main focus this term and have started reading our new class novel *The Creakers*, continuing to develop our reading comprehension alongside a focus on inferencing and making predictions. We have also been practising our reading at home and focusing on reading strategies as 'sound talk it', 'slide the snake', 'tommy tracker' and 'hop, skip and jump' to help us read fluently. Within Numeracy, we are currently learning to multiply and divide numbers by 10 and 100, before moving on to fractions and telling the time on 12-hour and analogue clocks. We have been working independently using our grids and enjoying carrying out different activities. This term we have been focussing on developing our fitness and recognising when we have made an improvement. We have been really enjoying P.E. and look forward to participating in different activities including aerobics, circuits, relays, and individual and teamwork games. We have been learning ways to stay safe, recently focussing on staying safe during bonfire night, alongside currently focussing on water safety, identifying and responding to emergencies and increasing our knowledge of being safe around our local community including focussing on the River Clyde. We have also been exploring the types of houses within Renfrew pre and post war. We look forward to another fun filled term of learning together








#### What have we been up to?

#### Base 5

Primary 5/4 and Primary 5 have had a busy start to Term 2. We have been enjoying learning about all different types of bridges as part of our Water in our World topic. We are now designing and creating our own self-supporting bridges. When finished we are going to test them out to see if they will carry the weight of a toy car. We are also looking at simple and more complex sea creature food chains and how fish and other animals are being re-introduced to the river Clyde. In outdoor learning we completed a range of autumn challenges using found materials in our playground. We are continuing work on our class novel *Song of the Dolphin Boy* and have been creating profiles of our favourite characters in the book. In Talk for Writing this term we are developing our skills in writing adventure stories. Our model text is 'Mission Possible' and we are looking forward to finding out all about spies and the technology they use to solve cases before we innovate and create our own spy adventure stories. Our focus in Numeracy and Maths is on developing our understanding of time in 1 and 5 minute intervals and 12 and 24 hour time. We are really looking forward to creating our Christmas art for the hall display and learning our songs for the Singalong.



**Base 6** In primary 6, we have recently written and sent letters to our Connected Classroom school in Hong Kong as parts of our Rights Respecting work. We are all very excited to receive our replies from the students and learning about life in a different culture. In Talk for Writing we have been writing our own portal stories focusing on using our imagination and including lots of descriptive language. We are starting our reading circles this week where we will be using our higher order thinking skills and enhancing our talking and listening abilities. We have started our new topic, World War 1 and have been learning who was involved and how it all began. War Horse is our new class novel, which we have just started and we are enjoying seeing the connection between our novel and our topic. We will be doing our own research at home as well to prepare a solo talk homework task. In numeracy and maths, we have been learning; how to draw circles, identify different triangles and developing our multiplication skills. We will be looking into division and angles soon too. In PE we are focusing on our fitness in school. We also visit Renfrew High School where we do PE with the school's Sport's Leaders, developing our team building skills. We have just started working on our class assembly, focusing on being safe in our community. We are going to be looking at road safety and stranger danger in and around the school. In science we have been learning about lifecycles. We have been learning about mammals, amphibians and birds. We are also going to be looking into the lifecycles of plants this term. We have lots of exciting things going on this term and can't wait to get our assembly under way!

**Base 7** After a busy term, the fun continues in P7. We have started our term 2 by choosing individual targets to help us towards achieving our Dynamic Youth Award. We have learned different skills and teamwork games which have supported us in achieving our goals and targets. We have started our lunch time clubs which consists of Lego, basketball, football, dance and games club. By the looks of things, all children are enjoying spending one of their lunch times with the P7s. We have been busy creating suspense stories through our Talk for Writing lessons and have started to explore warning stories. Miss Fulton joined us this term and has been teaching us all about newspaper articles. Most recently, we looked closely at a local historical event, The Glen Cinema disaster, which we have found extremely interesting. We will use all the skills learned to create our own newspaper article. As always, it's been a busy term with numeracy. We have looked at different strategies to support our multiplication and division and recently looked at angles (indoors and outdoors). We applied different addition and subtraction strategies to a different context by solving problems related to angles. Finally, we looked at Salvador Dali's art and identified features such as strange images and combined them with objects that would not normally go together. We decided to choose Scottish landmarks to alter using our own creativity. Term 2 will be special for P7 as it is their class assembly. Can you guess what our theme is?

Mr Dougan our Active Schools Coordinator organised and ran several lunchtime and after school clubs last term, which were well attended. He listens carefully to what children want and tries to put on activities to meet their needs and interests. Mr Dougan promotes different sports within our school community and supports the work of our school. He worked closely with Miss Orr and our Healthy and Active Committee and on Thursday we celebrated the presentation of our Sports Scotland Gold Award for our contribution to promoting activity for our youngsters. We had a great time celebrating and can't wait to fly our 3<sup>rd</sup> flag.

Our P7 children carried out a survery amongst our school community and this told them the clubs that children attend in or out of school. They met with the children who do not attend any clubs and asked them what kinds of clubs they would like P7 to run within the school. P7 worked in teams to plan and organise their clubs and this has results in 88% of children in our school now having the change to participate in a club, enhancing their wider achievement skills. P7 are now running a variety of clubs at lunchtime, which are very well attended. All P7 children are qualified Play Leaders, having taken part in training with Active Schools whilst in P6. P7 children will use their experiences as their submission for their Dynamic Youth Awards. These awards will be shown on their SQA Certification once they are at high school. Well done to P7 for all of their hard work and efforts.

#### Lunch Menu

#### Article 24: You have the right to good food, quality health care and clean water

Our children have been commenting upon the new school menu and our environmental team have been listening to their thoughts. Mrs Bannaghan has worked with headquarters to redesign some of the items on the menu that children were not keen on. For example, they asked that the katsu curry sauce was given as an option, and this has made a big difference to the number of children taking a school lunch and their enjoyment of the lunch. It is also helping us to reduce food waste. It is good to know that children have an active voice in Arkleston and are listened to, ensuring they make positive changes to their school. Children are not rushed out of the dining hall at lunchtime and have plenty of time to enjoy and finish their meal. We try our best to support all children and have recently noticed that our younger children are struggling to use a knife and fork. If you are able to support your child at home with cutting up their own food, this would really assist them in the dining hall.

#### **Project Playground**

#### Article 31 – Right to relax and play

We used our last committee time to speak to the children about life in the playground and to try and address some of our ongoing issues with overly physical play both on the MUGA and in the playground. Children have decided that they would like to zone the playground into certain areas and Mrs Kajla will be working with children to hatch a plan over the next few weeks, of what this could look like. Working with Brian Donnelly has led us to understand that many children have missed out on valuable social experiences during COVID, that have resulted in their social skills not being where we would expect them to be. This results in children lashing out when they are frustrated or angry, as we would expect younger children to do. It will take a long time to bridge this social gap, but with your support and changes to our approaches, we hope that we can create an environment for children to develop their skills within.

#### **Fundraising**

#### Article 24: You have the right to good food, quality health care and clean water

As a Gold Rights Respecting school, we are aware that there are children in the world whose rights are being denied for a variety of reasons. We have made a connection with a school in Kamplala, Ugands and they are in desperate need of new toilets for their school. P7 are keen to raise funds for Somerhill Kids Education Services to support this work and have organised a Rainbow Day on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> December. Children can dress in bright colours, and they are asking for a £1 donation. There will be various events on the day, so children can bring extra money if they wish to guess the teddy's birthday or guess the number of sweets in the jar. All information is on SEESAW. We look forward to seeing everyone dressed brightly on the day.

We know that the cost of Christmas has increased for families. Last year we ran a successful Christmas Toy Shop event and we would like to do the same again this year.
