




<u>Bargarran Primary School</u> <u>Newsletter for Parents and Carers</u> October 2024

Pantomime

On Wednesday 11th December our annual whole school pantomime visit is taking place. We will be going to the Beacon Theatre in Greenock to watch the pantomime 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. Details were sent out over Class Dojo earlier in the session. The cost has been kept to £10 per child as our Parent Partnership is kindly paying the cost of the transport. The aim of the visit is to provide all our children with the experience of visiting a theatre and experiencing a live performance. <u>Football</u>

Our football team played in their first festival of the season at Park Mains on Tuesday 8th October. The team played five matches against local primary schools. Scottish Football Association guidance does not allow scores to be kept. I can tell you that the team won all five matches scoring a total of twenty-seven goals. Nut Free School

We have a number of children who attend our school who have an allergy to nuts. As a school we operate a nut free policy to ensure the wellbeing of all our pupils. I would ask when sending snacks or packed lunches to school this policy is followed. Your support with this is greatly appreciated.

Remembrance

Our Primary 7 pupils will be selling poppies during the week beginning Monday 4th November. The minimum donation for a poppy is 20 pence.

The Primary 7s will be holding a Remembrance Service for parents, carers and senior classes at 10.55 a.m. on Monday 11^{th} November.

The school will be represented by Primary 6 Pupil Council members at the Erskine Community Garden Remembrance Service on Monday 11th November at 10.55 a.m. The Community Garden remembrance service is open to the general public and any parents and carers who wish to attend the service at the Community Garden are welcome.

Winter

As we draw closer to winter, could I please ask that all children come to school with appropriate winter clothing (jacket, hat and gloves) and footwear. Weather permitting, we plan to spend intervals and lunchtimes outdoors as, due to the darker mornings and evenings, children's time to play outside is restricted.

A school gritting plan is available to view from the school office and has been issued through the Class Dojo. On frosty mornings the entrance near to the community nursery will remain closed as there is not a gritted path from this entrance to the building. We will try to let you know, in advance through the School App, if this entrance is closed to allow journeys to school to be adjusted accordingly.

I apologise for any inconvenience caused by this, but the janitor only has a certain time allowance between starting his working day and the children arriving at school. It has been decided to prioritise gritting paths from the two main playground entrances to the school building.

Communication

This session we are holding a trial of using the messaging facility available through Class Dojo for parents and carers to communicate directly with class teachers. The content of messages and staff replies will be monitored. Parents and carers are asked to follow the guidance below during the trial period:

- > Please only send messages on Monday to Friday and between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- > Length of response times may vary. Instantaneous responses or responses during class hours should not be expected. Responses will be provided within three working days.
- > Please keep the subject of messages to your own child and relate to class procedures and organisation.
- > Complaints or issues regarding children other than your own, absences and change of day arrangements should be directed through the school office (0300 300 1447 or bargarranenquiries@renfrewshire.sch.uk)

Primary 1 Registration starting August 2025

Renfrewshire Council has asked that the following is shared with parents and carers.

If your child will turn 5 between 1 March 2025 and 28 February 2026, you should register them for school.

Register your child to start school in August 2025 between Friday 1 and Friday 8 November 2024.

If you, or someone you're helping, can't register online, you can contact your local primary school and make an appointment to register in person during the registration dates.

To register your child to go to another school outside of your catchment area, you'll need to register them at a school within your catchment area first, then make a placing request.

If you can't register your child for school till after Friday 8 November, please contact your local primary school directly.

Children who will be 4 when school starts in August 2025 can be deferred and get an additional year of free nursery and childcare. Please talk to your child's nursery or childminder.
