

Nut Free School

Earrings/Jewellery

Our P.E risk assessment does not allow jewellery to be worn for P.E. All children who wear jewellery to school must be able to remove the jewellery themselves before taking part in P.E. Earrings and other body jewellery are not allowed to be taped up and must be removed. We would also suggest children bring a small box to store any jewellery they have to remove to take part in P.E. Children wearing jewellery will not be able to take part in P.E.

Outdoor Learning

Our children enjoy the opportunity to learn outside and our teachers plan regular opportunities for their classes to learn outdoors. Could I please ask that children come to school prepared to learn outdoors by bringing a warm winter jacket to school with them. A hat and a pair of gloves would help children keep warm when outside. There have been occasions when we have not been able to take children outside to learn as they have not had the appropriate clothing. We would be happy to support any families in providing warm jackets for children. Please contact the school office where any requests will be treated in strictest confidence.

The school will close on Thursday 13th February at 3.00 p.m. for the mid-term break. We will open again for all children at 9.00 a.m. on Wednesday 19th February.

Reporting to Parents – Open Afternoon

Appointments for the Pupil Progress Meetings will only be available to book through Parent Portal from Monday 17 March.


School Attendance Procedures

It is a Child Protection concern when children do not attend school without contact from a parent and carer to explain a reason for absence.

Office staff are having to spend a great deal of time contacting parents who have not shown the courtesy to contact the school and inform us of their child's absence and the reason.

The school reporting absence procedures are detailed below.

Step 1	Please consider the two slides below.
Step 2	On the first day of absence contact phone the school office on 0300 300 1447 to report the absence before 9.00 a.m. or e-mail bargarranenquiries@renfrewshire.gov.uk Please do not send a message on Class Dojo or through the school web site as it may not be picked up.
Step 3	Please repeat Step 2 for every day of absence unless reason for attendance requires a period of isolation.



School Attendance Monitoring Procedures

If at any point you are concerned about your child's attendance at school or would like support with your child's attendance at school please contact the school office.

Attendance rates are monitored on a regular basis and the following procedures followed for attendance under 90%.

Step 1	Letter sent out informing Parent and Carer attendance is below 90% and offering support if required.
Step 2	If attendance remains below 90% a second letter will be sent out and the initial point of contact will be in touch to discuss attendance levels.
Step 3	If attendance remains below 90% a third letter will be sent out offering a meeting with HT to discuss attendance.
