Where **NOT** to park...

In front of the school,

blocking access to other drivers, school buses, deliveries and affecting the safety of people accessing the school.









In the Zig Zags, at the bus stop or across from drive ways.

This causes congestion, stops the buses from stopping safely and can affect the safety of pupils getting on or off the buses or trying to get to the playground.









Blocking FOOTPATHS.

This makes it difficult for pupils to cross the road safely and for people in wheelchairs or pushing prams.





At the junction close to Ferry Road.

This causes an obstruction for cars turning out of the junction and blocks the crossing into the school.
