As we put up the tree and Christmas decorations in Brediland it's time to share our plans for the 10 days of Christmas, starting on Monday 7th December!

Please note that the Christmas lunch has still to be confirmed and will be the best it can given we cannot serve traditional meals as yet. We will decorate the lunch hall and there will be Christmas music too.

Class Christmas Baubles (Bubbles) Panto Parties: our class bubbles will be transformed into 'Christmas Baubles' on 17th December, to replace the parties that we usually have altogether in the hall. Children should come dressed for parties on the day.

An online pantomime, Cinderella, has been purchased, to be shown in classes, at the same time across the school. Instead of class parties in the hall, crackers, cakes, crisps etc will be provided, to be laid out on each child's desk, to enjoy during the panto.

Instead of the traditional three Fridays of crazy socks, crazy hair and Christmas jumpers for the PTFA, this year we are having Christmas jumper (or any other Christmas clothing of choice) on Friday 11th December (£1.00 for school funds – payment through Parent Pay is preferred).

We asked the children which activity they would like on Tuesday 15th December, and they voted for a Crazy Christmas Hair Day, just for fun!

Since returning in August the children and staff have all worked tirelessly to make up for lost time and their efforts have been outstanding. I cannot thank the whole school community enough for coming together in the way it has to make this difficult situation work.
