School App for Parents launch!

We are pleased to announce that we have invested in a school app that can be downloaded on both Apple and Android phones and devices. School App for parents will provide instant notifications to your phone and instant access to school information. The app will replace our old system of paper newsletters and should hopefully keep everyone fully up to date with news and events. So this will be the last paper newsletter for a while!

How do I get the App? Search the App store or Google Play for School App for Parents on your device. Once downloaded, open the app and login to Brediland Primary. Alternatively, you can scan the QR code on the leaflet attached – this will also allow you to download My School App.

Children's Reading Books

In line with current guidelines, we are now able to send reading books home as part of your child's weekly homework. Reading books will be sent home on Mondays and returned on Fridays. The books will be cleaned before going home and after they are returned. When returned, they will be stored in isolation for 72 hours before being filed back in bookcases.

Maths Week Scotland is a celebration of the importance of maths in our everyday lives. This week will be filled with exciting mathematics activities in school and the chance to participate in a nationwide Sumdog challenge at home! Reporting to Parents/Carers

This session, due to restrictions, parents' meetings in school cannot go ahead in the usual format. Following this, on Monday 9th November, individual child interim reports will be sent home in the same format as last session. The Interim Report gives detail about progress and attitude to learning. As always, Class Dojo provides daily updates to parents/carers on behaviour, progress and dojo points awarded in line with the school values.

Mental Health and Wellbeing

Emotion Works



One of our priorities for this session following lockdown is the mental health and wellbeing of our pupils. Last session, we introduced the Emotion Works programme across the school. Emotional Works is an educational programme that helps develop children's emotional literacy and wellbeing. Since our return, we have been following a specifically designed recovery programme, which is delivered to each class at a pace that's appropriate to them. Over the past 4 weeks, we have been focusing on building positive relationships and we have also been looking at regulation activities, which are useful for calming any stress and/or anxieties. When they are ready, the classes will then move on to learning about the Emotion Works cogs again. These cogs are used to help children talk about their feelings. From P1 upwards, we will reintroduce the first 5 cogs to pupils and remind them how they link together. In the older classes, we will also look at the grey cog, Emotion Intensity, and the purple cog, Influences. These are trickier concepts but older children may be able to explain them to you.

If you are concerned about the mental health and wellbeing of your child, please phone the school and ask to speak to a member of the management team to see what we could do to further support your child. We also have access to the Exchange counselling service, mentioned in the last newsletter, for our Primary 6 and Primary 7 pupils. Exchange can provide targeted support for bereavement, friendships and parental separation.
