Mobile Phones and Electronic Devices



As some pupils may have been given new electronic devices for Christmas I thought it would be worthwhile to remind you all of our school policy on the use of these in school.

If you deem it necessary for your child to bring a mobile phone with them to school, it must be switched off and kept in their school bag at all times. Children are not permitted to use their mobile phones within school time and the school takes no responsibility if they are lost or damaged. Children should not be using their mobile phones to take videos or photographs within the school grounds.

Children should not be bringing other electronic devices to school to use at break times or golden time. At Bushes we like to encourage children to build friendships and relationships with one another and find that the use of such devices at these times does not support this.

Registration of Infant Beginners in Primary Schools Session 2019-20

Children who reach 5 years of age between 1 March 2019 and 29 February 2020 inclusive should be registered in their catchment area school as follows:

Pupils whose surnames begin with initials A to L should be registered on Wednesday 16 January 2019.

Pupils whose surnames begin with initials M to Z should be registered on Thursday 17 January 2019.

Registration will take place between 1pm and 3pm on each day. If you are unsure of your catchment school, please contact the school office staff who will be happy to help. Parents should produce their child's birth certificate, and two proofs of residence, which must include council tax notice for the property or proof that you have registered for council tax at that property, and a letter from your solicitor confirming that missives have been concluded, a rent book for rented property, tenancy agreement or a mortgage/bank statement. **Original documents** must be produced.
