Pupil Equity Fund

The Pupil Equity Funding (PEF) is additional funding allocated directly to schools and targeted at *closing the attainment related poverty gap*. The Scottish Government has committed to this funding as part of the Scottish Attainment Challenge programme. Each school receives £1200 for each pupil in P1-S3 in receipt of free school meals.

How can Pupil Equity Funding be used?

The money must be used to support activities and interventions which focus on and lead to improvements in Literacy, Numeracy and Health and Wellbeing.

For the financial year **2019-20** we were allocated **£63,720**. This money has been spent on various activities and initiatives aimed at raising attainment including: employing extra staff as well as giving existing staff further roles and responsibilities, offering targeted support in Literacy and Numeracy, and purchasing new resources that support teachers and pupils in their classrooms.


