Not in nursery please!


We would ask that children do not bring their own toys to nursery. Some children have been bringing their own toys to nursery many of which have been lost or broken. Staff are finding it difficult to find toys if they have been misplaced.

Nursery Fund

Many of you now pay this on a termly basis. For those of you who do Term 4 is 9 weeks long. This takes into account all holidays and in-service days. If your child attends for five sessions each week the cost for the term will be £31.50.

Tooth Brushing Programme

The children continue to participate in daily tooth brushing sessions. We work closely with our Oral Health Co-ordinator who provides support and ongoing training for the nursery staff.



Getting it right for every child

Taking care of our children's well-being helps us to ensure the most positive outcomes for them in later life. It gives them the potential to grow up ready to succeed and play their part in society. The benefits of taking good care of them are significant - both for the individual and for society as a whole. Every child and young person in Scotland has the right to play, to be healthy and happy, to learn new things and to be looked after and nurtured. These rights are set out in the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child. This is an international law that seeks to make sure the voices of children and young people are taken into account in families and children's services.

To promote the Getting It Right approach we, along with our partner services, consider a child's well-being in the same eight areas to ensure a consistent approach. The eight well-being indicators are - Safe, Healthy, Achieving, Nurtured, Active, Respected, Responsible and Included. This approach allows us to make sure that our children are growing and developing and have everything that they need from the people who look after them.



Child Protection is everybody's responsibility. If you ever have concerns about a child you must report these to the nursery, social work department or police. All staff are fully trained in Child Protection and receive refresher training annually.

Attendance


