### Renfrewshire's Nurturing Relationship Approach

As a school and ELCC, we are working towards our Jade level in Renfrewshire's Nurturing Relationship Approach. The Nurture Principle we are currently focussing on is 'All Behaviour is Communication'. To support with this, we have implemented the following across the school and ELCC:

- Visual timetable to support consistent use of visuals.
- Lanyards with emotion cards to help children communicate.
- Promoting Alternative Thinking Strategies (PAThS) to help children have the awareness of their feelings and the vocabulary to deal with them positively.

A few classes will also be trialling emotion check ins during terms 2 and 3.

All of this work is aimed at continuing to develop the nurturing environment at Bushes for the benefit of all of our children and their families.

## Gifts for Members of Staff

Last session, I sent out a note on Seesaw regarding gifts for members of staff. I would like to remind you of this once again.

As a staff, we love working with your children and we all do our very best for them on a daily basis. In previous years, some parents and carers have chosen to recognise this in a variety of ways, one of them being giving gifts to staff at Christmas and/or at the end of the school session in June. This has always been viewed by staff as something that, although is extremely generous and greatly appreciated, is not something we would expect or require.
