#### Dogs in the Playground 🕑



A reminder that dogs are not permitted within the playground regardless of whether they are on a leash. This rule also applies to any dogs that are being carried by their owner within the playground. I appreciate your understanding and support in this.



#### Mobile Phones and Electronic Devices



If you deem it necessary for your child to bring a mobile phone with them to school, it must be switched off and kept in their school bag at all times. Children are not permitted to use their mobile phones within school time and the school takes no responsibility if they are lost or damaged. Children should not be using their mobile phones to take videos or photographs within the school grounds.

I would ask for you to support us in ensuring your child is using their mobile phones safely by:

- Regularly reviewing your child's social media accounts and their online communications
- Regularly reviewing their privacy settings on any social media accounts, they have
- Reporting any inappropriate behaviours or actions to the police

Also, children should not be bringing other electronic devices to school. At Bushes, we like to encourage children to build friendships and relationships with one another and find that the use of such devices does not support this.

# YM Pupil and Parent/Carer Feedback

Thank you very much to all the parents and carers, 48 of you, who took the time to complete our recent parent/carer feedback questionnaire.

#### In the pupil survey:

Examples of themes pupils fed back that they felt makes Bushes a good school:

- People (children and staff) are happy and kind and care about us
- Lessons are fun and interesting
- Good resources and equipment
- School Values
- Celebrating outside successes
- Easy to make friends
- Playground is fun

Examples of themes pupils fed back that they felt would make Bushes an even better school:

- More outdoor resources
- More after school and lunchtime clubs
- More rubbish bins and stop dropping litter!
- Picnic benches and improve the look of outdoors

#### In the parent/carer survey:

Examples of themes parents/carers fed back that they felt the school does well:

- Parents are listened to and supported
- Events for parent participation and opportunity to gain feedback- open afternoons, shows etc
- Values and community ethos
- Nurturing, inclusive, and caring environment and staff
- Teachers' relationships with individual children and knowing each of them well
- Fun learning and good teaching approaches
- Communication and providing information on Seesaw
- Fairness and approachable
- Whole school events e.g., House prizes, Sports Day, Scottish Showcase, Hot Chocolate reward and Values assemblies
- Trips e.g., Lockerbie and whole school trips

Examples of themes parents/carers fed back that they felt the school should look to continue to develop:

- Further develop use of Seesaw to share updates with parents
- More clubs and opportunities for activities outside of classroom including non-sporting ones along with school teams e.g., netball and football
- Further supports for pupils both with their learning and when making poor behaviour choices
- SLT in playground at start and end of day

Examples of themes parents/carers feel Pupil Equity Fund (PEF) money could be considered to be used for:

- School staff to support with pupils learning and making good choices
- IDL
- Sumdog
- Seesaw
- Sports Clubs

Lastly, please be assured that we do take on board all your views. I read every response and make sure that the themes are noted and analysed. Your views do genuinely matter, and we take them on board. We will add this feedback to the feedback from other stakeholders and utilise this to inform our improvement priorities going forward.

# Attendance

On average, attendance <u>above 95%</u> is what would be aimed for across the school year as there are direct links between attendance and children's attainment. I monitor attendance across the whole school on a monthly basis, to ensure that children are attending as often as possible. I am fully aware children may need to miss school for occasional appointments or illness, but I would like to ask for your continued support in helping your child to attend school as much as possible. It is also extremely beneficial when children attend school on time as it sets them up positively for the day ahead. If you are facing any difficulties in supporting you child to attend school or to do so on time, please reach out to us and we will do all that we can to support you in this. The more children attend school, the better opportunity they give themselves to reach their full potential.
