23/24 Standards & Quality Report for Digital Learning: Assess, Build, Innovate

Our Digital plan is bringing about improvements in infrastructure, resources and digital pedagogy.

Good progress has been made in implementing our Digital Plan – **Assess, Build, Innovate** to promote a flexible, layered and empowered approach to **digital learning**. Our strategy is underpinned by the aim to develop **high quality learning and teaching** that leads to improved levels of attainment and achievement in all of our establishments.

★ Infrastructure

What did we intend to do to bring about improvement?

To improve our infrastructure and ensure that all children, young people and schools have access to hardware, wifi and well-researched digital platforms/software to ensure equity and improve outcomes.



Progress and Impact:

All establishments have had wi-fi upgraded and are able to access high speed broadband.

Next Steps:

• Ongoing accelerated work on **upgrading** switches in all establishments.

* Resources - capacity and capability

To ensure all practitioners have improved skills and increased confidence in using digital tools to enhance learning, teaching and parental engagement.

What did we intend to do to bring about improvement?

- Support schools to achieve Digital Schools Award Scotland (DSAS) and/or Digital Wellbeing Award (DWA).
- Carry out bespoke discussions with schools on digital device requirements.

Progress and Impact:

- A session was offered in May 2024 on the Digital Schools Awards. Attendees were given the
 opportunity to hear from recently awarded St John Bosco Primary about their Digital School
 Award (DSAS) journey and from Glencoats Primary about their Digital Wellbeing Award (DWA)
 journey.
- There was also an opportunity to hear about the new awards coming soon from Digital Schools
 Awards, including an Endorsement Award for those awarded DSAS more than 3 years ago and
 an ELC award specifically for Early Years establishments.
- **St Charles'** Primary and **Langcraigs** Primary were awarded their **DSAS** and **Bargarran** Primary and **Mary Russell** School were awarded their **DWA**.

- In addition, Rashielea Primary gained their Endorsement Award! Well done!
- Establishments were supported **financially** to replace broken projectors with **Promethean** panels.







Next Steps:

- Continue to support establishments on their Digital Schools Awards journey, including the new awards, and sharing the journeys of establishments who gained their **Digital Schools Award** or **Digital Wellbeing Award.**
- Review the **rolling ICT refresh programme** for establishments.

★ Engagement, coordination and communication

Creative use of various digital platforms strengthens family learning in almost all establishments.

What did we intend to do to bring about improvement?

- Continue to engage with Scottish Government around the device promise for P1 S6 pupils.
- Bespoke support for schools to increase the number of families using Parents Portal.
- Continue Get Safe Online Ambassador programme for Primary and Secondary school staff.
- Roll out Group Call to replace SEEMiS text messaging.

Progress and Impact:

- This session schools increased the number of parents signed up to **Parents Portal** to a minimum of 50% across all schools.
- Staff continued to access the **Get Safe Online (GSO) Ambassadors Team** where resources and ideas are available for them to use within their own schools.
- **Group Call** was rolled out to all schools. Bespoke **training** for staff took place in **May** 2024 and initial feedback has been very **positive**. This aligns with our **Green Print Strategy** and will ensure less need for paper based copies of documents for parents.
- Our DigiLearnRen blog reached over 2750 unique visitors!



2 - Renfrewshire Get Safe Online

- In May 2024, a session on planning your school's digital strategy was offered in conjunction with Education Scotland. Over a third of establishments attended the session.
- It was rated **5 out of 5** by attendees, with **100%** saying they would **implement the learning** in practice and **share the learning** with colleagues.



3 - Digi Learn Scot

Next Steps:

- Further Get Safe Online Ambassador Training will be offered next session for Secondary and Primary staff. Book now on <u>CPD Manager</u>.
- Introduce Safer Schools App to establishments to support online safety for parents.
- Further training will be offered to establishments on Group Call and the use of the Parents Portal app.
- Relaunch of Glow blogs to evaluate establishment websites.

★ Learning, teaching and assessment

Provide professional learning on digital learning pedagogy to promote a shared understanding of, and provision of, high quality learning online.

What did we intend to do to bring about improvement?

- Practitioners will access CLPL and bespoke establishment sessions provided by the DL Team and
 partners on digital learning pedagogy to promote a shared understanding of high-quality digital
 learning with a focus on planning, learning, teaching and assessment.
- Post CLPL surveys will demonstrate that almost all staff have increased confidence and understanding, including the skilful use of digital tools and platforms.

 Primary practitioners will be offered CLPL on the new Renfrewshire Computing Science Progression Pathway.



Progress and Impact:

- Digital Learning Champions Team had content added to this session, alongside the Apple Regional Training Team (RTC).
- The RTC offered **14 face-to-face** sessions, training over **200 staff** in using iPads to support learning and teaching. Within the RTC team, **support** and **advice** is shared regularly, including how to become an **Apple Teacher**.
- **100% of attendees** who completed an evaluation said that the session had **made changes** to their practice that **directly impacted on learners**.
- Our RTC Facilitator, Ruth Burnett successfully completed her Apple Coach training this session as well.


4 - Read&Write

- Throughout this session, schools have had free access to Read&Write using Chromebooks, as
 part of the Text Help Pilot. A third of our Primary Schools received bespoke training from Text
 Help.
- This pilot will be reviewed at the start of next session and recommendations made.
- Primary 4 teacher feedback 'The Read&Write programme has been very beneficial to learners
 in my class particularly supporting pupils with Dyslexia. They have been able to use the 'Talk to
 type' feature to support them creating texts during writing lessons and answer comprehension
 questions fully. It has also supported children with producing more extensive pieces of writing
 and completing tasks within allocated time slots.'
- **Google for Education** hosted a series of Renfrewshire engagements, including a **Gripe Jam** for staff to identify what they wanted to learn.
- Following on from this, Google for Education led an **InService** day, 2 in-person **twilights** and 2 Google Meet **webinars**, specifically **tailored to staff needs**.

- Attendees also had access to a **Google Classroom** for asynchronous support.
- Feedback from attendees: "Really enjoyed the wide range of areas covered really feel I have learned lots!" and "My highlights were practical and hands-on experience using the Chromebook, learning some of the shortcuts and how to use accessibility tools effectively."

Next Steps:

- Digital Learning Champions will be refreshed and further opportunities to share practice will be provided.
- **Bespoke support** for establishments will be offered, linked to their planning of their digital strategy.
- Support will be given for implementing the new Primary Computing Science Progression Pathway. We will evaluate the impact of this throughout the session.
- The **Apple RTC** will continue to offer training and support for all things **iPad** related.
