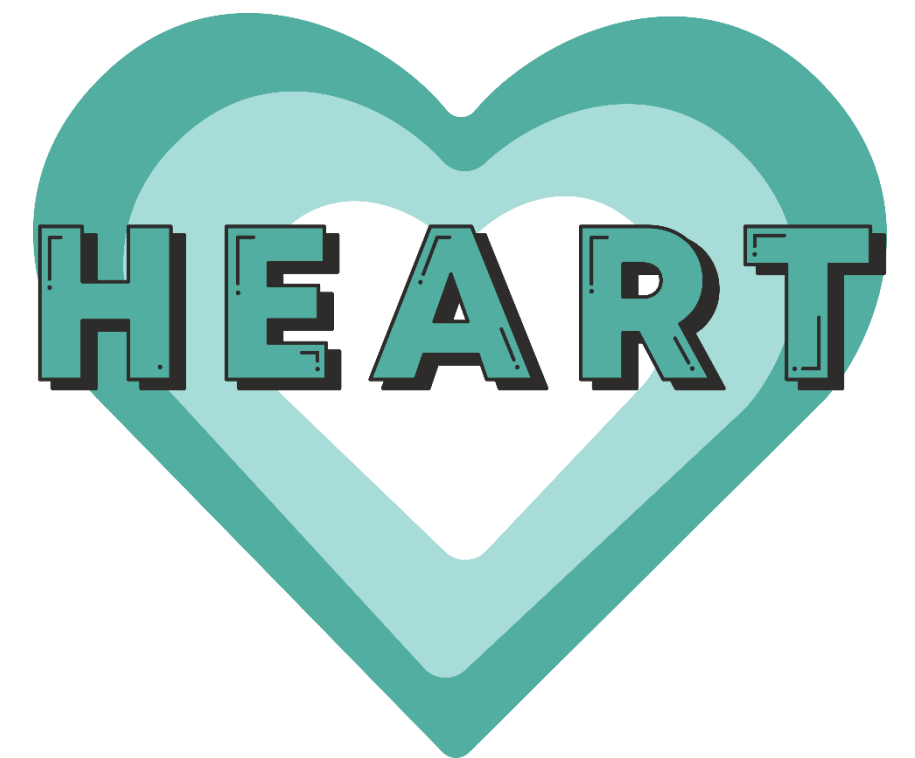

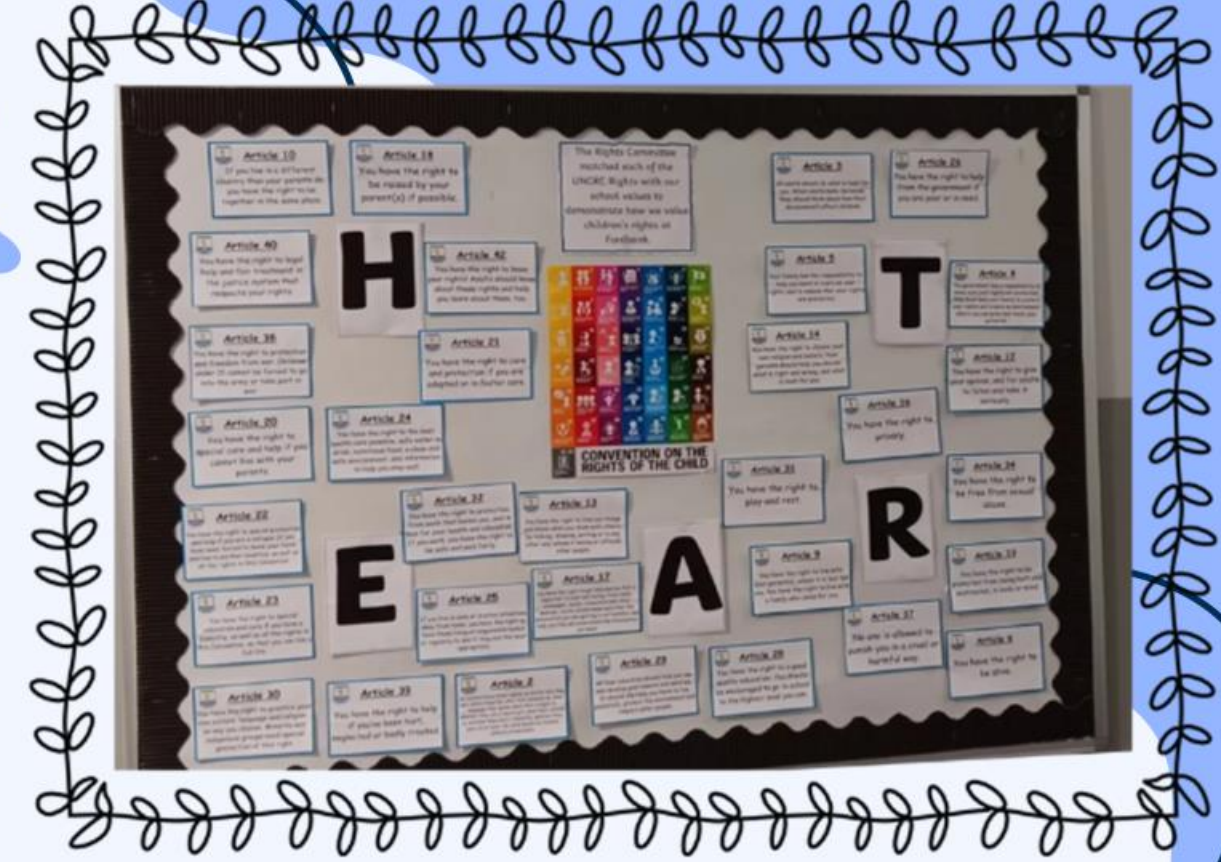

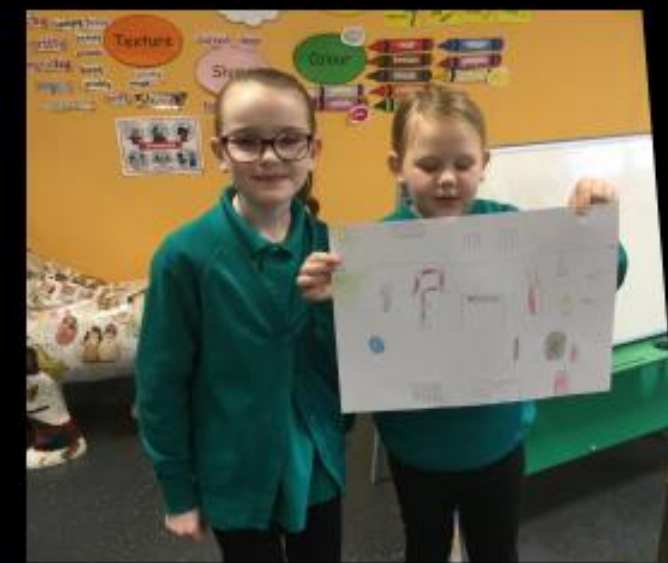

- Shared our ideas with Ms Wadsworth.



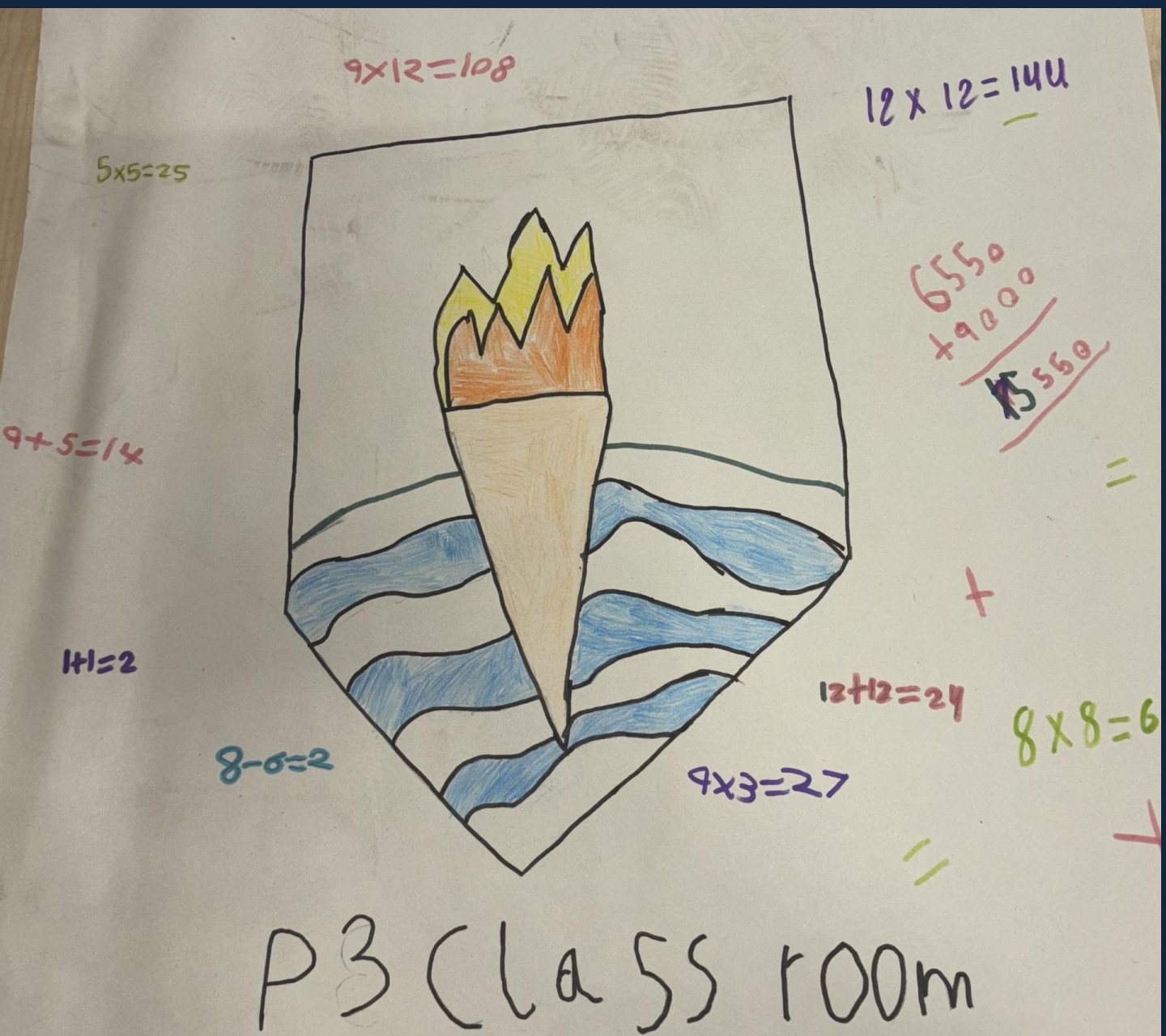

Our Journey



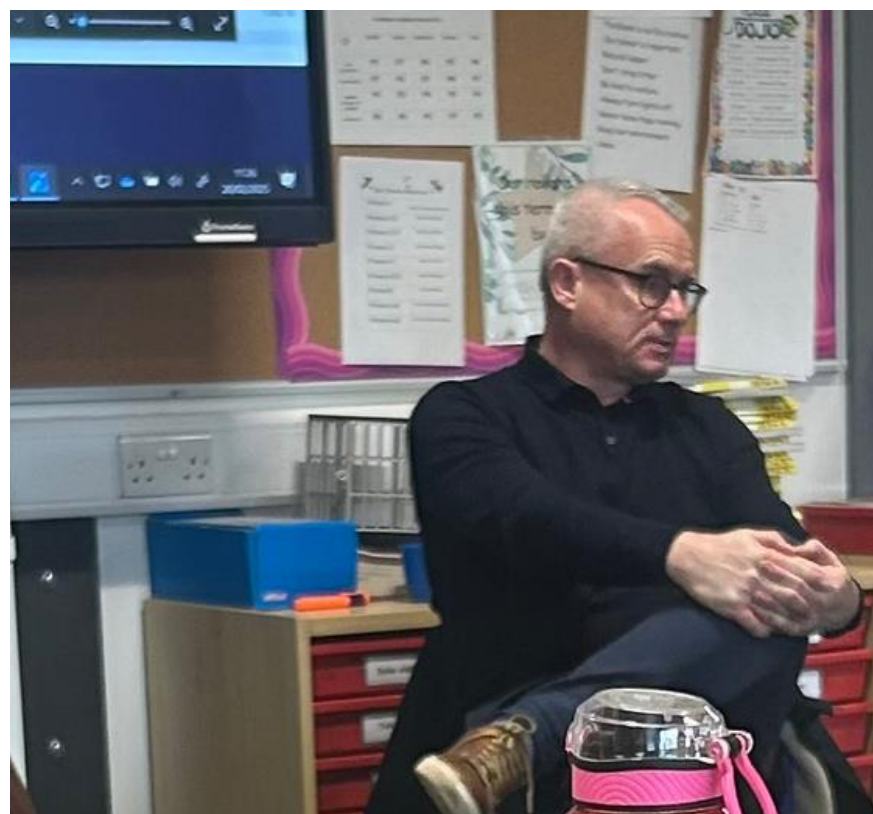
We went a walk round our local area.
