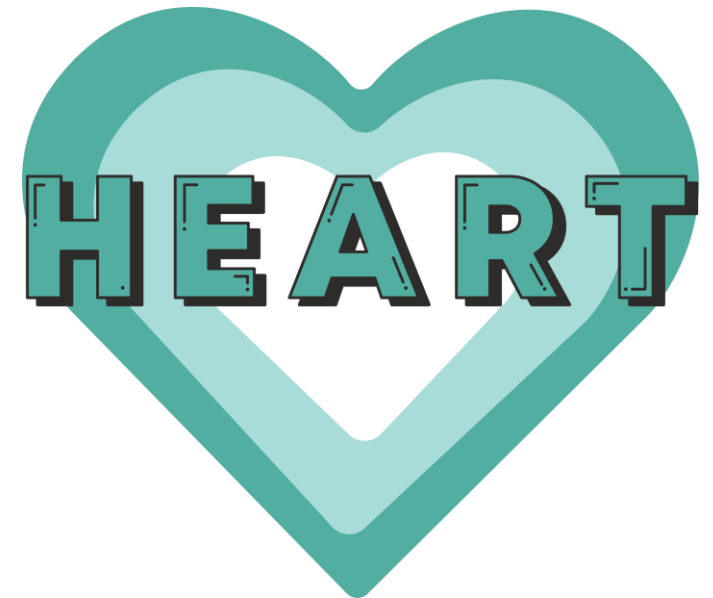

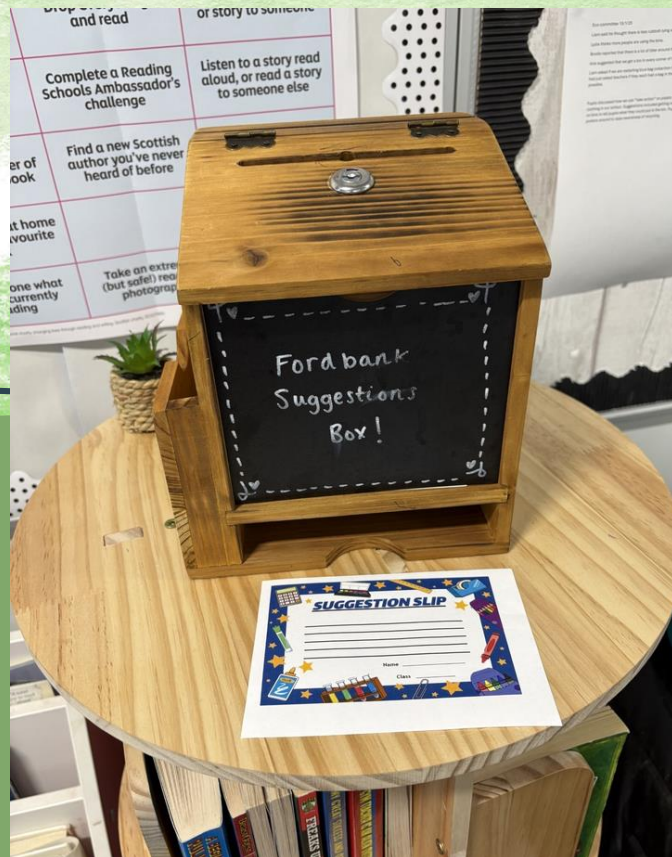

At Fordbank Primary School, we want to...

WHY? Why are we doing this? It is important that we can all read and write so that we can use these skills in other areas of our lives. We need to be able to read and write so that we can use technology efficiently.

WHAT? What will you see? Some children will receive targeted support for reading, writing and numeracy. Our letter work will clearly show what we are learning, and our wall displays will show off our great work. We will be more confident when doing new things.

How? How will we know if we improve? More children across the school will achieve the nationally expected progress in Literacy and Numeracy. Our skills in problem solving, questioning and recording will show a deeper understanding of what we have learned, and we will be able to transfer this across the curriculum.

At Fordbank Primary School, we want to...

WHY? Why are we doing this? We practice and apply our skills in our learning, but we want to get better, talking about which skills we have been using. Becoming more confident at this will help us when we are older, especially when we are looking for jobs in the workforce.

WHAT? What will you see? We will learn language that we find useful and talk about our skills at assembly. Our Pupil Groups will have a focus on skills, going to the choice to practice our new language. We will use SEESAW to profile skills and achievements.

How? How will we know if we improve? Our learning in class will be focused on the skills we are using and not just the content we are learning in. We will be able to reflect on the link between our achievements and the skills we applied in these. We will display and talk about our AWES (Amazing Wonderful) Learning events.

Fordbank Primary School, we want to...

WHY? Why are we doing this? Our voice is important. It is the law that we learn about our rights under the UNCRC and that these rights are in action. It is everyone's job to look after us and make us safe. Our positive relationships help us when we need support.

WHAT? What will you see? We will establish Pupil Leadership Groups, Rights Respecting Schools, SHANARRI group and ANTI-RACIST group. We will use our voice to enact change and share this in assemblies. All classes will have a class charter linked to the UNCRC.

How? How will we know if we improve? We will achieve our silver Rights Respecting School Award. We will be able to talk about the different pupil groups and the supports that they offer. We will be kind to others and uphold our school values and their rights.

Languages Committee

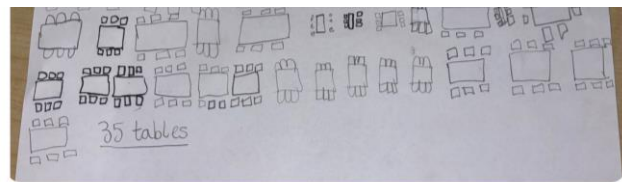


We organised a whole school Christmas sing-along for Christmas songs from around the world! It was fantastique.

We made chalk drawings of the Eiffel Tower.

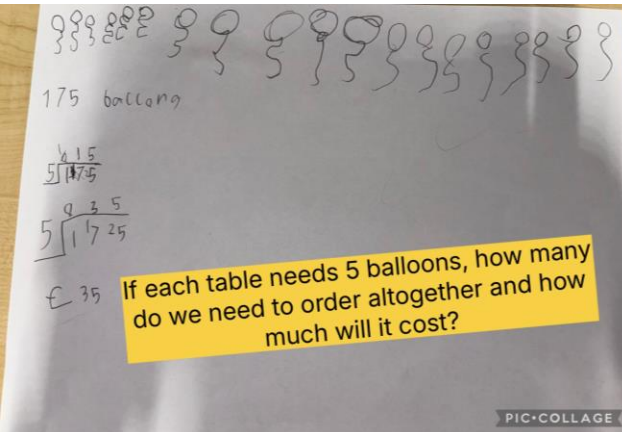


We watched cartoons in French and listened out for French vocabulary that we had learned in class. From P1 to P7's all stages managed to interpret learned vocabulary.

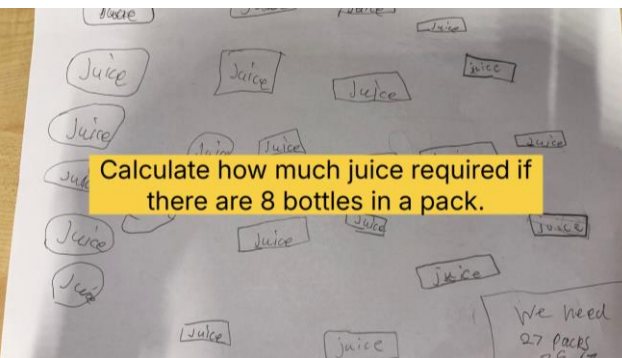
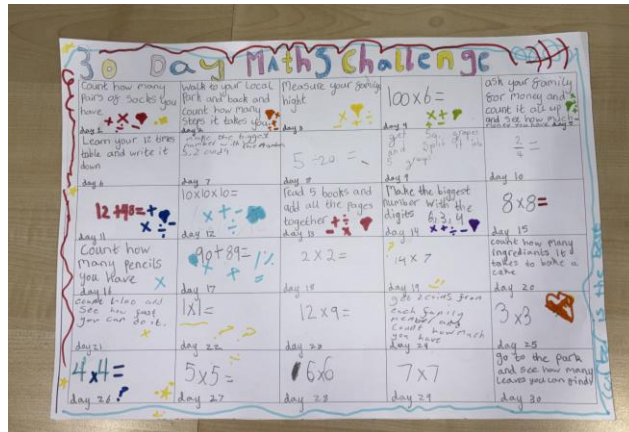


Calculating tables needed if each table seats 6 people.

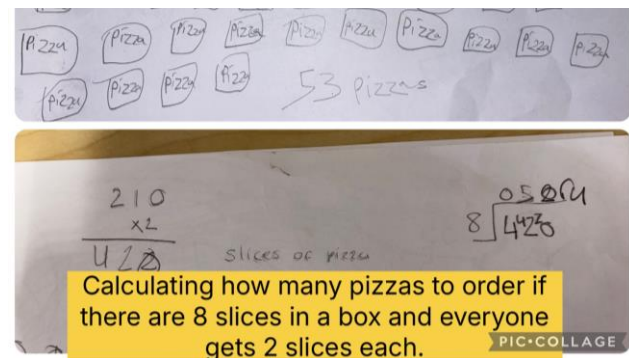

We also took part in the Great School Maths Party Challenge. We planned for a whole school party and used our problem solving skills to calculate how many tables were required, how much pizza and juice to order as well as how many balloons each table would require and the cost of this.

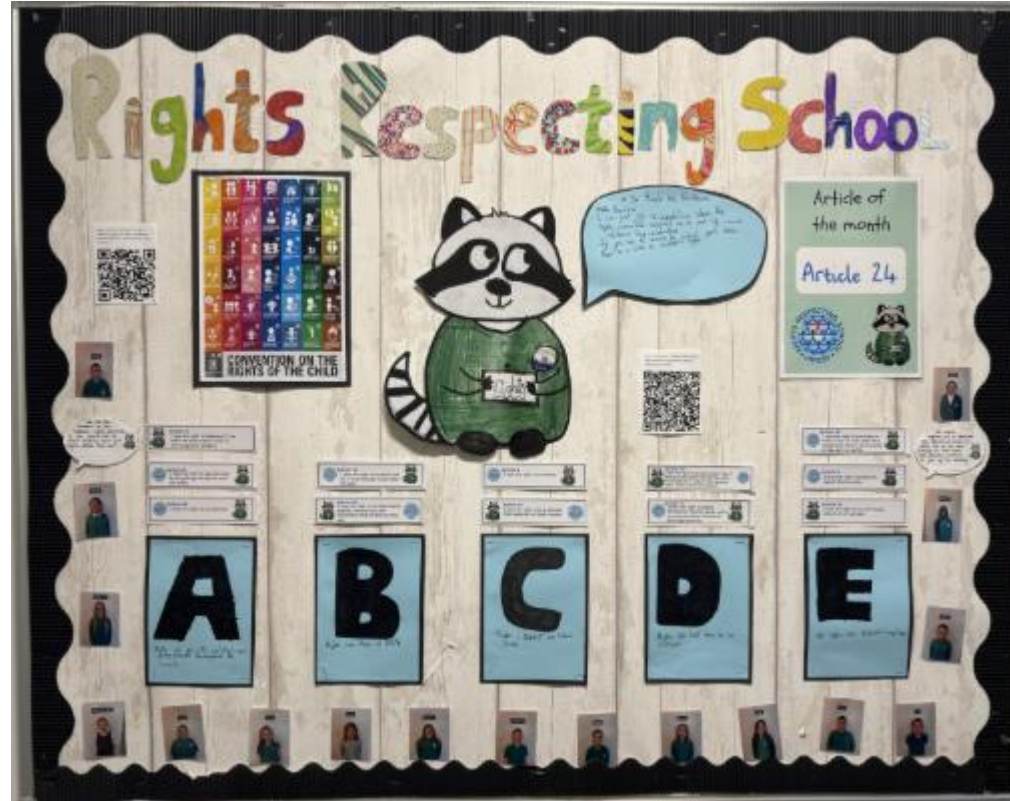
Rights Committee 25-26
