A big thank you to Mr Taylor, Miss Currie and our Pupil Council who worked hard on our action plan. We are being ambitious and aiming to have our Silver Award by the end of this academic year.

## **GL** Assessments


This session we are using GL Assessments. These formative assessments will be used with all children for English, Maths and Health and Wellbeing. These assessments will highlight strengths and gaps in learning, identify and support children with additional educational needs, deliver evidence of whole school improvement, reveal barriers to learning, provide evidence of progress and directly inform teaching strategies. This data and information, along with class based evidence and teacher judgements, will provide robust evidence of attainment levels. Pupil Attitudes to Self and School (PASS) is an all-age survey that all children will complete this month. It provides information on our children's mindset towards school, and if they are confident, ready and motivated to learn. Although we know our children well it may be that a concern is identified and, where appropriate, actions can be taken to provide support if not already being addressed.

## School uniform

Please can we ask that children wear school uniform. Although the majority of our children do wear uniform and look very smart each day, we have a growing number of children coming to school wearing clothing that is heavily branded, has large graphics and isn't school colours. Please keep these items for our designated own clothes days.

## Scottish Performance afternoon to celebrate Robert Burns Day

On 25 January each class will present a Scottish song or poem to the rest of the school. This will be hosted by our house captains.
