Welcome to the September Newsletter. Already we have lots going on in and around the school, especially with all our out of school clubs having started.

#### P7/6 Assembly

Many thanks to P7/6 for a wonderful first class assembly this academic year. P7/6 used various curriculum areas such as art, drama and music to tell us about their class novel 'Varjak Paw' by S F Said and what they had learnt from it.

It was lovely to have so many parents/grandparents/friends of P7/6 join us. It is not always possible to have people join us in school for such occasions so it is lovely when we can and the children are so well supported. Thank you.

#### Science Trips

P7/6, P6/5 and P4/5 all enjoyed a recent day out at Glasgow Science Centre sponsored by Scottish Power. Bright Sparks was a free special event giving pupils the opportunity to take part in handson energy themed workshops.

#### SeeSaw

We are continuing to use SeeSaw to share and communicate with our families. Your child will post to SeeSaw to share their learning. Pupils and teachers will use this app to photograph their most recent and best work. The purpose is to facilitate a high quality learning conversation between you and your child. There is no requirement to like or comment on the photographs. Please sign up to create your account once you receive the Scan Code letter from your child's teacher.

#### Ongoing Works

The internal painting of the school continues with the pupils toilets being started during the September weekend. All works should be completed during the October holidays.

Our 104 Solar panels are now up and running. We hope to have an input soon at assembly to discuss their workings and energy generated as a result.

#### Website

A quick and easy way to keep up to date with news within our school is to sign up for our email updates on our website. The system resets during the summer holidays, so even if you have subscribed before, you still need to re-subscribe for this year. More than one family member can subscribe for updates. So far we only have 8 parents subscribed.

#### Pupil Equity Funding (PEF) - Update

As you will be aware, the Scottish Government has invested in all Scottish schools through PEF. Allocations are based on the number of pupils from P1 to S3 who are eligible and registered for free school meals, using the latest available data.

PEF is allocated directly to schools and targeted at closing the poverty related attainment gap. It focuses on improvement activity in literacy, numeracy and health and wellbeing.

Last year's Parent Questionnaire stated that 93% of parents felt that PEF had made a difference to their child. As a result of this, session 2018-19 spending will again be aimed at similar areas e.g. Nessy Spelling & Reading as well as Sumdog ICT software. On top of this, we have bought in Clicker 7 software aimed at supporting children with their writing activities.

We have also used this to buy two new, state of the art interactive boards and staff training to support this technology.

The Parent Council has generously offered to fund a new board and the school will be purchasing one which means that every class will now have access to this wonderful technology.



#### Staffing

As many of you will already know, Mrs Patton our Classroom Assistant, is off on long term absence as she continues her battle with breast cancer. Mrs Patton was delighted and thanks everyone for the beautiful flowers she received recently from the Parent Council and Pupils. Mrs Patton is greatly missed, especially by the children during play/lunchtimes. We wish her well and a very speedy recovery.
