The monthly reports are very generic and provide no insight into individual pupil's progress

Inchinnan Primary is quite unique in its use of regular progress reports as these are not a requirement for staff, however Inchinnan Primary staff are very keen to engage and keep parents as informed as possible. Each report is a short update which has a specific focus e.g Aug/Sep - settling in class, October - Literacy, January – Numeracy etc, this keeps them manageable in terms of staff workload.

### **Wishes**

More music workshops and Spanish for all levels, no reason it should not start at P1 – continually looking to developing our music programme. 'Go for Bronze' workshops for P3/4 and P5/4 this term. French undertake as second language, third language input for P5 – P7 is Spanish (requirement of Scottish Government to have 3 languages). This links in with both the school staff capacity and Park Mains our link catchment Secondary School's capacity to continue with modern foreign languages to exam level.

Communication about school policies and procedures need to be communicated to parents

Most information available on school website or in school handbook (also on website). If not please contact school directly.

Go paperless – Working on this, many parents still requesting / prefer paper copy

Better communication including website, dates of services etc. Dates for all services were on September newsletter, available on website. Parents can subscribe to receive a direct link as soon as any information is posted on the website, well worth doing.

Communication about everything – Communication highlighted as both and star & wish? Parent leaflet being produced to help parents recognise the numerous ways the school communicates with parents

Medication policy – Unclear/Unreliable – Clearly outlined in school handbook

More trips and learning outside school – The school highly values the benefits of a school trip or learning out with School. This is evident by the use of our 'Golden Book' where children are encouraged to bring in any achievements undertaken outside school and these are added to

the book, placed in the newsletter and read out at assembly. School trips/excursion are only undertaken if there is an educational gain for these. The school is also mindful of individual circumstances and costs implication of trips/excursion

Helping children believe in themselves confidence building – focus this session to introduce ‘Growth Mindset’ approach

Ensuring children get their gym lessons - P7 not getting PE time recently

In line with Scottish Government commitment that all children undertake 2 hours of PE a week. Inchinnan follows this recommendation, however there maybe times depending on other activities that are taking place in the school that PE times may be moved or undertaken through other areas of the curriculum e.g Golden Time, Residential trips, Outdoor Learning etc

Our child has been at school for four years and **not once** has her house won the party, she feels it is unachievable – Records checked and within last 2 years all houses have won a house party.

Be useful to speak to Maths teacher – all staff are willing to meet with parents if required, please just call the school and arrange a time that suits all .

Uniform recycling

More project based homework

More communication about pupil relationships (issues in playground) – Parent leaflet being produced to help parents identify various ways the school communicates with parents. Open door policy in place if parents would like to speak with school, however staff will only be *able to discuss your child with you* and not comment on other children.

More info on class blog - agree, working on this

More digital – online payments, online parents’ evening booking – online payments – Currently available for out of school clubs (not all parents use), programme being rolled out by authority for school meals etc.

Concern re the change in teachers for P2 looking for consistency now and a consistent teacher in P3 – always our aim but not always within school’s control e.g mat leave/absences, secondments etc.
