Fundraising - Children in Need

During Book Week Primary 2 and 3 were presented with Read, Write and Count bags. These are fantastic bags filled with books and resources to inspire a lifelong love of reading, writing and counting. P1 also receive a Bookbug family bag, which was presented during their visit on the skoobmobile library bus, which was really enjoyed by all. These bags are gifted by Scottish Book Trust through Scottish Government.

Communication Survey

As part of the schools ongoing commitment to self-evaluation, leading to school improvement, we have recently asked P7 parents (being the longest at the school) and P2 (the newest full year parents) to take some time to consider and complete the survey focusing on communication. Many thanks to the 8 parents who have already taken the time to feedback their views to the school. The survey is still open, and I look forward to receiving some more responses in the near future allowing us to evaluate and improve/adjust as required.

Universal School Meals Expansion

From Wednesday 6 January 2022, all primary 5 pupils will be able to receive a universal school meal and it won't cost parents a penny. P5s will join P1, P2, P3 and P4 in receiving a universal school meal as part of the Scottish Government's expansion of healthy meals to all primary pupils.

New school meal menus will also go live in January. School meals still need to be balanced to ensure they meet the new food regulations, but children will get their favourites as part of the new menu, just not all the time.

A representative from the Soft Facilities Team recently met with the Parent Council to gather feedback around school lunches. Soft facilities will also be meeting the Pupil Council to gather pupils views as well, which will be taken into consideration for the new menus in August 2022.

I hope you all had an opportunity to read the Parent Council's recent newsletter. You may have noticed that throughout the pandemic the Parent Council have still been regularly meeting and raising funds through their bonus ball system. These funds are always then spent on various activities or resources to support the school and we can't thank the Parent Council enough for giving up their time and energy away from their own families and responsibilities to undertake these tasks and support the work of the school.

Since returning in August the Parent Council have purchased for the school, new goal posts, basketball stands and balls for the playground. They have bought new dyslexia friendly reading books and picture



books. They have offered funding for the christmas parties and P7 residential trip.
