

This award is a great introduction into leadership giving learners knowledge of how to organise small games and activities. It is being delivered by Fraser Buchan (Active Schools Coordinator) alongside the class teacher Mr Johnston. Learners will all receive a Leadership Journal which they can use to record what they have learnt and done during the course; what they have enjoyed and what they found most challenging. Certificates will be awarded once learners have completed the core elements of the PlayMaker Award and have put PACE into practice.
