#### Class Assemblies

Cooperative learning skills were evident through each group's study of individual animals that live in this climate. Music and language skills were really brought together by P4's original rap, which was immensely enjoyed by all, well done P4

P5 then rounded off the month by sharing their learning around the 'Titanic' topic. Again, many links across the curriculum were evident, from the research around passengers and the ship itself, the models made and the science experiments that explored various aspects around floating and sinking, as well as the environmental impact caused by the melting of ice and ice caps on the earth. ## Rights Respecting Schools

As you will be aware from the school improvement plan sent out earlier this session. Rights Education is a major focus for the school this year. The 'Rocking Rights' pupil committee have already presented at Assembly and spoke to everyone about the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC). All staff have also undertaken training on the Convention which has 54 articles that cover all aspects of a child's life and set out the civil, political, economic, social and cultural rights that all children everywhere are entitled to. It also explains how adults and governments must work together to make sure all children can enjoy all their rights.

The UNCRC Rights of the Child Booklet is now available on the Parent Club and school website. This resource provides information for parents, carers and family members about children's rights and introduces the UNCRC. We will also add this to seesaw for your information.

## Skooterbility

Primary 3 and Primary 4 were lucky to take part in a Session of Scooter Training with Craig Dalziel the Bikeability Co-ordinator. The bikeability team brought all the scooters/helmets for all the children in P3 & P4. They had an hour long session learning about taking care of your scooter, correcting handlebars, steering, balancing and safety. The children received a certificate for taking part.
