Chess Club Update

A wee report on the UK Chess Challenge that we just completed. It was a very keenly fought competition, with the result going down to the wire! Indeed only 3 points separated the top 8 with the others not far behind. In the end, 3 children finished on 17 points out of 21, and a tie break was applied with the result that Marcus McDonald P7 retaining his School Chess Champion title and wins the trophy, Roman McPhee P5 finished in 2nd place and Joshua McDonald P5 finishing 3rd. The children received their certificates and prizes just before 'Spring Break'. A special mention for Roman who went along to the Mega Finals, the next round in the UK Challenge, where he competed in the Under 10s and came away with a fantastic 3pts out of 6, in a field which included children who are on the verge of playing for Scotland! Well done indeed!

Eco - Committee

The eco-committee were delighted to be involved in building bird boxes to encourage more birds to nest in our local woodland - Teucheen Woods. Along with the practical skills involved the group also learnt about the type of birds their boxes would encourage and why this is so important to the whole eco system.

As you can see from all the items above - our pupil lead committees have been very busy. As a school we find the committees not only give the children a chance to develop their interests but allow them to develop teamwork and leadership skills. Skills that are vital in the wider world of work and life.




Staffing
