Quality Assurance Visit

We were delighted to welcome Julie Colquhoun our link Education Manager (EM), Clair McCrossan EM and Mhairi McDonald a Head Teacher from another school, to Inchinnan Primary on Friday 9 February, as part of the local authority standard quality assurance process for all schools. Their visit consisted of a pupil lead tour of the school, professional dialogue with the Senior Leadership Team, visit to classes and meeting a pupil focus group to gather children's views of the school. Their feedback was extremely positive with relationships, amongst all identified as a strength of the school, resulting in a positive, nurturing ethos

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where children feel involved, consulted, and cared for. Almost all children were engaged and motivated by the tasks and activities on offer in observed classes. Children were observed to be extremely well-behaved, fully participating and enjoying their learning. All teachers observed delivered lessons which were well-structured and had clear explanations and instructions, lessons were appropriately challenging and met the needs of almost all children. Support staff provided effective help to children who require additional support for their learning. Well done 'Team Inchinnan' .

Staffing

We welcomed back Mrs Kay this month for a couple of 'keeping in touch' days before her full return on Thursday 21 March. Mrs Kay will be returning on a part time basis of 2 days a week, with Mrs de Lange moving to 3 days a week. This in effect will mean that Mrs Kay will take over from Mrs de Lange's all day Friday in P2/3 and most of Thursday in P4/3.

I am delighted to say that following interview and recent training, Mrs Ross is now 'The Promise Keeper' for the school . The Promise is the outcome of Scotland's three-year Independent Care Review, where more than 5,500 care experienced children and adults took part, to transform the wellbeing of infants, children, young people, and adults. 'The Promise' is the Scottish Government's commitment to listen to the voices and needs of the care experienced community so that Scotland is "the best place in the world to grow up in" where all children are "loved, safe, and respected and realise their full potential". As part of our commitment to keeping The Promise in Renfrewshire, every school should have a Promise Keeper, who acts as local champion, helping to educate and improve services for care experienced people.

Physical Education (P.E.)

A gentle reminder re gym kits - for children to safely participate in all PE activities, children should be wearing suitable clothing which allows freedom of movement and reduces risk of catching. Please ensure your child has, a change for gym activities of shorts, t-shirt and a change of shoes suitable for indoor PE activities, if laced, children should be able to tie these. Watches, rings, chains etc. must all be removed before P.E. Unfortunately, adults cannot assist with removal of earrings. We would suggest, if a child cannot remove jewellery themselves then these should be removed before coming to school. As always, the school is not liable for any loss or damage to items brought in. Long hair that could be a hazard must be secured.
