Protecting our children

With approximately only 18% of children's time spent at school, parents and carers have a vital part to play in supporting their child in this way.

Nine in ten children aged 8-17 have been spoken to about online safety, with the majority (89%) most likely to have been spoken to by a parent.



Barriers for parents

Factors include:

- Fear of the topic area or belief it won't happen to their child
- Feeling overwhelmed by online risks and pace of changes in technology and social media
- Believing their child is too young to learn about it
- Own experiences of harm online
- Not wanting to feel 'preached' to by others
- Negative experiences of professionals or the education system
- Feeling competent and confident enough already on the topic
- Believing that school will provide enough information to their child
- Believing that their child knows enough or more than them already
