Many thanks to all those who managed to come along to our 'Meet the Teacher' event on Wednesday 3rd September. This gave parents a chance to meet their child's class teacher, hear about the main structures and class routines as well as ask staff any questions that they had. Attendance rates varied from 40% - 60%, however we fully appreciate that not all parents could make it to this event and therefore to support with this, presentations have been shared through Seesaw.

Our new Pupil Council has been formed and I'm delighted to announce the following representatives voted for by their class peers:



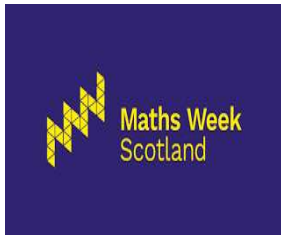

P7 Bikeability

Following the postponed Bikeability input from last session, P7's have recently had the opportunity to take part in Level 2 Bikeability award. Many congratulations to all who achieved at this point. A huge thanks to the staff and trained parent helper – Mr Shaw for helping deliver this training, it is a big responsibility and we couldn't do it without all their support 🙏. P6 will have the opportunity to undertake this later in the session, alongside P5 working on Level 1 Bikeability.

New Developments across the school

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We will also be focusing on many other areas. You may have already noticed your child posting on seesaw their **individual targets**, which their class teacher will have discussed with them beforehand and will review and set new targets throughout the year. Please talk to your child about their targets and continue to encourage and support them as they work towards these individual and specific targets for each learner. Many thanks 😊

Another new development for this session which builds on previous excellent classroom practice is the introduction of 4 **Discovery days**. Each day will have a specific focus, and each class will visit all the stations over the course of the day. These promote an enquiry-based learning approach where pupils learn by actively investigating questions, problems, and scenarios, rather than being presented with facts. Our first Discovery Day is on Monday 10th November and the focus will be our committees with each committee preparing an enquiry based activity based on their focus for the year. PACE workshop –

We had a very kind offer from PACE theatre company offering us a free taster session. One session on Tuesday 21st October for P7 and the other at 1pm on Wednesday 22nd October for P5 & P6. A very creative session was enjoyed by all, thanks PACE.



Class Assembly - P7

Our class assemblies got off to a great start with P7 leading the first one of the session. The whole presentation was based a very creative recap on their class novel study related to Kensuke's Kingdom by Micheal Morpurgo



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Visible Fiction P5-7 Workshops

Visible Fictions, a Scottish charity creating theatre and learning projects for young audiences, linked to the Curriculum for Excellence. They recently visited P5-7 with 'The Impossible' — an audio drama and creative learning experience at a reduced cost due to early bird booking and school size 😊.

How it worked: In advance of our visit the school was sent a suite of creative learning resources to share with the class. These explore the science and history of flight / resilience and mindfulness, all linked to the Curriculum for Excellence. On the day we had a great workshop from visible fictions! We listened to an audio story all about Amelia Earhart and spoke to us through different strategies we can use if we are feeling anxious or nervous or even just having really big feelings and not sure what to do. We had some great involvement from everyone and definitely learned a lot!



P7 Fun Makers input/award

Many thanks to Nicole Brown our Active Schools Coordinator for coming in and leading a couple of sessions with P7 to refresh them about 'Fun Makers' a programme where older pupils lead activities at breaktimes for the younger ones. Some research that I thought might be of interest to parents....

- Long-Term Perspective: Over the course of 18 years, a child spends only about 9% of their total waking life in a classroom, emphasizing the importance of learning experiences outside of formal schooling.
- Focus on Out-of-School Learning: The large amount of time children spend outside of school presents a significant opportunity for learning at home and in the community.
- Parental Role: Research indicates that parents' engagement and the creation of a stimulating learning environment at home can be more crucial to a child's attainment than their socio-economic status.
