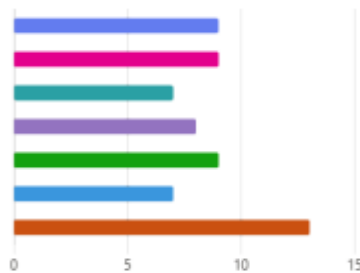

Many thanks to everyone who responded to our recent parent questionnaire, which received a 57% response rate from our whole parent body 😊.

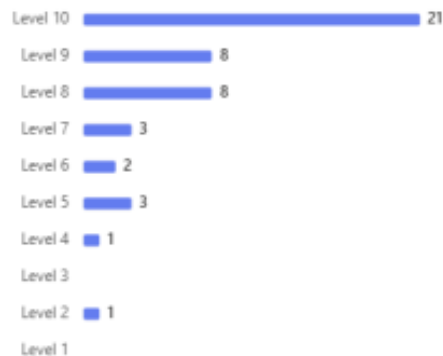
Results have already been shared and discussed with the Parent Council.

Following last year's request by parents we have reduced the messages going out via seesaw and tried to ensure that seesaw posting is focused on posting individuals best and



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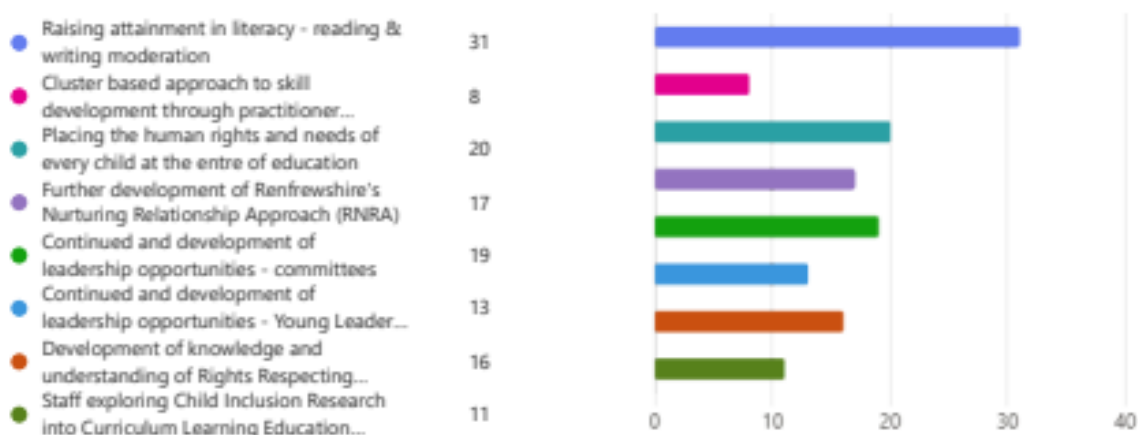


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latest piece of work. Teachers are committed to ensuring work is posted regularly and covers a variety of curriculum areas.

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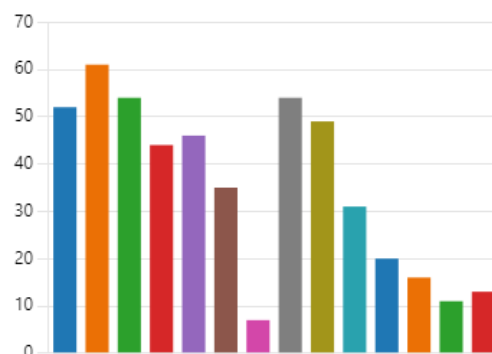

We operate an 'open door' policy and would always encourage parents to speak directly with the school if they felt their child did not receive the help they need to do well.



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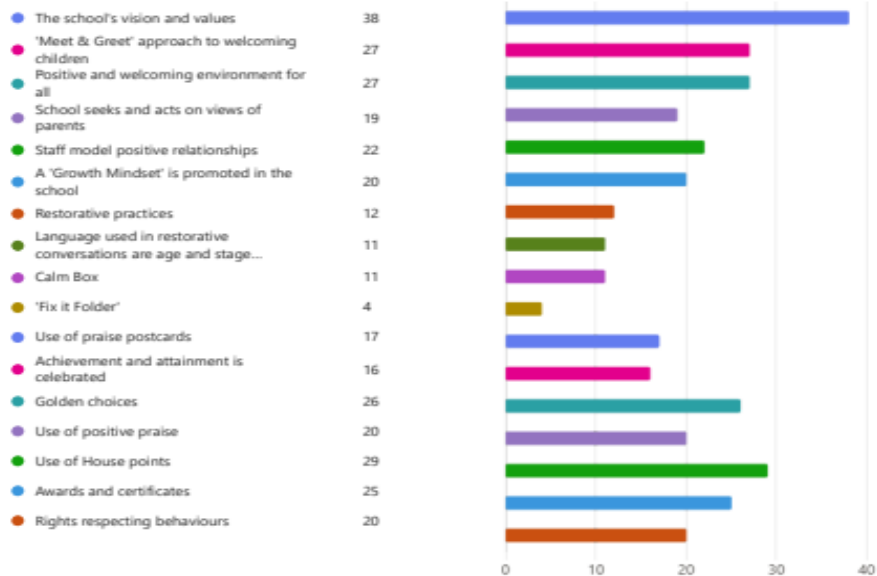
