Each class had the opportunity to listen to stories and songs, learn Maori words and phrases and some even learned the Hakka! Joe was impressed with our confident P1 pupils who performed their own Maori song. Other classes prepared for Joe's visit by learning Maori stories and creating Maori artwork, learning facts

about New Zealand and creating Mihi poems. Joe's visit has sparked an international connection between Kilbarchan Primary and a Primary School in New Zealand which the staff and school are very excited about. We hope to make our first connection soon! Once again we would like to thank Joe and Anne for their time and for providing such a rich learning

experience for both children and staff.
