Dear parents and carers,

I have been so pleased to see the way in which every class has embraced outdoor learning this term! Every class is regularly timetabled to use our outdoor space to support activities across the curriculum, to build independence and to promote a healthy and active lifestyle. It has also been shown that outdoor learning can help to build stronger communities, ones that focus on sustainability and equality issues whilst supporting children to use their skills in new contexts.

In line with this approach, we will be encouraging our pupils to play outside at intervals and lunchtimes as much as possible and, perhaps more frequently than in the past. I would ask that all children come to school prepared for this with warm, waterproof jackets. The school is happy to help any parent or carer provide such a jacket, please just speak to Mrs MacKenzie.

We have been working hard to improve the parking situation in and around the school gates. As a quick reminder, no cars should park in the bus park area or upon the Keep Clear lines directly opposite the gates. Parking in these areas limits traffic flow and makes it dangerous for children to cross the road safely. Thank you for the support you have given me as we work together to improve safety for all our pupils.

One final point, we have had to change the date of our Hallowe'en Disco as it clashed with a Primary 7 transition event at Johnstone High School. I would like to thank our Parent Council for being so flexible in this matter and for working so closely with the school to ensure the event can still go ahead. The new date is Thursday 26 October.
