Dear Parents and Carers,

We are coming to the end of our first term of 2020 and what a term it has been! As you know we have been working hard to ensure that all pupils and staff are safe and healthy given the current situation. Here are some of the measures we have put in place:

- Gentle start in the morning
- Frequent washing of hands
- Increased cleaning of the school building throughout the day
- Children remaining in their class bubble whilst indoors
- Staggered intervals and lunches to minimise numbers mixing outside
- No sharing of resources between classes unless items have been quarantined
- Daily washing of play resources
- Quarantining of items going to/from home
- 2m distancing between teachers and pupils wherever possible
- · Wearing of masks and other forms of PPE when required
- Staggered exit of infant classes at 3pm with families maintaining 2m distance at school gates and wearing masks if possible

Playground Update

The building works in our grounds should be coming to an end in the next few months and we would like to use this as an opportunity to improve our playground and purchase new equipment for our children. As you can imagine an undertaking such as this can be costly and so the school will be linking with a number of different companies to find the best option for our school. Our fundraising activities in the coming months will assist in the purchase of this new equipment.

The ideas put forward by the companies will be shared and discussed with our pupils, staff and families in order to ensure that all views are taken in to account. Homework Review

This term has seen a change in the way we provide homework activities. Due to the need to minimise items sent home, we have had to put this work on Glow and Google Classrooms, the platform we used during lockdown.

A questionnaire designed to gather your views on this will go live on our website this week and will run until Tuesday 6 October.

Gentle Start

Our Gentle Start will continue after the October Holiday however the timings will change. Children will be able to enter the building from 0900 – 0915. If your child arrives after this time we ask that they enter the building via the Main Entrance.

If the weather is particularly inclement we will continue to allow children in from 0845, as has always been the case.

Wet Weather Items

As the seasons change, and with our continued focus on Outdoor Learning, the school is pleased to able to inform you that we have recently purchased a considerable number of waterproof jackets and wellies. We will not ask children to go outside if we feel the conditions are too dangerous but we do want them to able to explore the environment around them, even on those wet days.

Feedback from Parent/Carer Questionnaire

I would like to thank all those parents and carers who completed our Return to School Questionnaire (ended Tues 1 Sept). Here are some of the results:

- 95% of P1 families found the visit in June helpful and 100% thought the booklets were helpful.
- 95% of P1 and 88% of P2-7 families were either extremely or somewhat confident with the implementation of COVID-19 guidelines in the school.
- 100% of P1 and 91% of P2-7 families found the Powerpoint helpful.
- 100% of those asked felt that the school had kept them up to date eg via letters.
- 84% of P1 and 100% of P2-7 families felt they were able to ask questions and speak to members of staff. Those who said they couldn't, noted that this was due to COVID-19 restrictions.
- 100% of all families felt that their child had had a positive start/return to school in August.

We hope that subsequent letters and updates have answered some of the questions families posed. If there is an issue you feel hasn't been resolved, please do not hesitate to get in touch.
