# **Primary 7 Transition**

# Primary 1 Transition

# **End of Year Reports**

An end of year report for every pupil will come out later this term, around May/June. It will identify the levels achieved, key strengths and areas for further development, along with an overview of how they have coped over what has been a challenging year. #### **Risk Assessments**

We continue to update our risk assessments and guidance as more information is released from the government. We are asked to remind families of the importance of ensuring the pupils wash their hands for a minimum of 20 seconds before leaving the house in the morning and upon their return home in the afternoon.

# Lunches

Now that we are in Term 4, children with packed lunches will be allowed to eat outside as long as they follow our high standards for playground cleanliness. This will apply to packed lunches provided by the school or from home however we will ask that hot meals continue to be eaten indoors

### Sunscreen/sun hats

With the better weather and a focus on outdoor learning it is likely that pupils will be outside and exposed to the sun for longer periods of time. We are unable to apply sunscreen to pupils so ask that families apply this before they come to school in the morning and/or provide their children with a sun hat (please ensure it has their name on it).

#### **Uniform**

We have two lovely parents (Mrs Munton and Mrs Macleod) who are regular helpers with our Reuse Recycle Uniform scheme. For those of you who don't know about this, we accept previously worn uniform items from parents which are quarantined, cleaned, and organised by age/size. These items are then available for families to take at no cost. In the past we would put the racks of clothing out at events held throughout the year but of course this has not been possible.

In order to make this available for parents/carers again, our two helpers will be organising the uniform items on Friday 30 April in our outdoor classroom. They have informed me that **should you wish any items**, **you should contact them through the Parent Council Facebook page before Friday 30 April with your requests**. They will then put your pack together and organise a way in which to get it to you.

# **Primary 3 Drama**

We pleased to say that we have managed to work around the current restrictions to ensure that our partnership with West College Scotland has been able to continue this year. On Wednesday 28 April Primary 3 will have an online drama lesson from students at the college. We have followed all internet safety recommendations to make this a success. The performance has been pre-recorded, our pupils will not be seen by the drama students and no part of the lesson will be recorded. The drama students have also provided individualised packs for each pupil which were delivered to the school today to quarantine them in time for the lesson.
