We have several children whose Annual Consent for Offsite Excursions form has not been completed on ParentPay. It is imperative that this has been signed off by parents/carers so that children can participate in such activities with their classmates. Playground Improvements

In the afternoon of January 20, our pupil council and Parent council met together with a representative from a company who can help us to make improvements to our playground. The pupils shared ideas, gathered from the rest of the pupils in the course of their duties and class representatives. A new trim trail and possible painted games were considered, along with suitable locations for the items. The pupils helped to measure the areas, providing accurate information that will help us get an accurate cost. We also spoke about the need to consider the health and safety of these new items and how this could be maintained over time.

More of these meetings are planned as the children learn about the importance of gathering a range of quotes before a job is granted.

Aaron (P3) said, 'A new Trim Trail would be good because we would have more choices of things to play with. There would be more for the pupils in Primaries 5 – 7 because they don't have as much as the other children'.

Abigail (P3) said, 'I want it to be fair so that everyone has something to play with'.

Road Safety

We welcomed local councillors, pupil council committee members, representatives from Kilbarchan Community Council, and the Road Safety Officer from Renfrewshire Council, along to the school on 24 January to hear more about the issue of road safety around our school. It was a very productive meeting, with all participants sharing their views and listening to others. Our pupils spoke clearly and passionately about the problems and gave ideas as to how it could be improved.

David (P6/5) said, 'We want improvements so that it helps children cross to school safely'. Ella (P6/5) said, 'Improvements could help children walk to school by themselves because just now some of them want to but can't because it isn't safe. It would also be a safer environment for children'.

We will continue to work in partnership with all those present and our Parent Council to find a way to move forward.

All the children enjoyed the Burn's Ceilidh which brought together all Primary 7s across the cluster with the S1 pupils for an afternoon of dancing and fun!

On 31 January we began our transition of information for those pupils going to Johnstone High in August. Mrs Robb and Miss Montgomery met with the S1 DHT Mrs O'Malley and Mrs Smith Pastoral Lead to discuss pupil progress and need. During this time our Primary 7 pupils were taught by a JHS teacher so that they could begin to get to know one another. This highly successful partnership continues our focus on transition.

On the same day, we welcomed some our upcoming Primary 1 pupils into school along with their parents/carers. This informal event enabled those attending to see the classbases, meet some of the teachers and find out more about how the day is structured in Primary 1. All those attending found it helpful and were able to ask any questions they had. It was just lovely to be able to welcome new members of our Kilbarchan Primary school family into the building!

Strathgryffe Tennis

Our Primary 1, 2/1, 3/2 and 3 classes have been benefitting from input from Strathgryffe Tennis club. The coach has been working with the children and their teachers, building their skills, teamwork, and fitness levels. Every time I have been in to see it in action, I can see how much learning has been taken place and how much the children have enjoyed themselves.

Georgia (P3/2) said, 'The coach Graeme was really fun. We got to throw the ball up in the air, turn around and catch it. We were practising the skill of catching the ball'.

Amelia (P3/2) said, 'We were playing a game of tennis. We had to dodge the balls and move quickly'. Logan (P3/2) said, 'We were jumping, bending, and throwing. We had to follow the rules'. Rebecca (P3/2) agreed and added, 'Having rules makes the games more fun because you know what to do'.
