

Information for parent/carers about Langeraigs' Financial Education week

Dear parent/carer,

we are having a Financial Education week here at Langeraigs Primary for classes between p4 and p7. It will take place between Monday 6th and Friday 10th of June, though some activities may run over into the following week if required.

All p4-p7 pupils will have an introductory and plenary session at an assembly, before and after the planned week.

Some of our Learning Outcomes are

- To understand about our own money and that our decisions have consequences that affect us and others
- To increase awareness of the relative benefits of saving and spending in everyday situations
- To think about the long-term view of handling money, how we can pay for things and how money can affect our feelings
- To learn about how bank accounts operate, how we can keep our money safe, and the links between jobs and money

All pupils will

- Look at the factors that influence the way in which we make purchasing decisions
- Be able to use information to make informed choices about purchases
- Be able to differentiate between price and value, needs and wants
- Have the opportunity to taste and express their preference for a food source.
