Primary 5/6 Homework Programme

Session 2023/2024

Homework is an essential link between school and home and therefore your support in this matter is very much needed. Below you will find a guide to what is expected of your child in P5/6 each week and also each term with respect to homework.

Spelling

Spelling homework will be given out on a Monday for the full week. Your child should complete one of the spelling tasks and they will have until the Thursday to complete it. Each Friday there will be a spelling test and it is important that your child revises their words for the test.

Reading

Reading homework will be issued every Thursday. Your child should prepare the pages for Thursday of the following week as they have associated tasks to complete in class.

The content of their reading book should be discussed in order that it is fully understood and also that any unknown vocabulary is looked up in a dictionary to ensure your child knows the meaning.

Maths

Maths homework will be given out on a Monday. This should be completed for the Thursday of the same week. Occasionally there will be no Heinemann related homework, therefore on these nights revision of times tables would be beneficial. In addition to this, there may be mental maths homework issued.

Topic

Topic assignment homework will be given occasionally throughout the year. This will be accessible via Google Classroom or if this is difficult to access at home a paper copy will be given. There will be weekly ICT slots and daily Homework Club sessions to complete any topic tasks.

PLEASE NOTE – The school cannot print out topics handed in on U.S.B devices or C.D. format, due to council regulations.

Listening/Talking

Your child will be asked to prepare a 2-minute talk in Term 1 and Term 3. They will be given 1-2 weeks to prepare the talk at home and they will present it to the class.

It is important that all homework is checked for errors, corrections made, then signed by parents or guardians.

Finally, please check and sign your child's homework diary.

Our PE days this year are Monday and Wednesday, if possible, please bring a change of shoes to keep the gym hall and equipment clean.
