Dear Parent,

Below is an outline of what your child will be learning about this term. There are eight main curricular areas and, due to the flexible nature of Curriculum for Excellence, some areas may just be touched upon or may not be covered at all during a particular term. Therefore, do not be concerned if there is little or no information for a particular curricular area below. Be assured, that over the course of the school year, pupils will cover the requisite range of skills and experiences and outcomes appropriate to their particular stage.

Mathematics

- Multiplication (2, 3, 4, 5 and 10 times tables)
- Division
- Fractions
- Time
- Measure (weight and length)

Please practise times tables as often as possible at home. While it is useful counting on in 2s, 3s, 4s etc, e.g. 0, 2, 4, 6, 8, 10 etc, it's vital that your child knows the full times table for quicker recall of multiplication and division facts, so please practise the full times table, i.e. 2 zeros are 0, 2 ones are 2, 2 twos are 4 etc.

Language

- Core Reading Schemes (ORT/Project Origins)
- Nelson Comprehension - To gain a deeper understanding of what they have read.
- Nelson Spelling - Every week your child learns a new spelling rule with the aim of transferring it into their writing. There is a spelling test every Friday.
- Nelson Grammar - Teaches skills which are also transferred to writing.
- In writing, we will be focusing on 'Talk for Writing' again. Our work is going to be linked to our environment, where we will be learning about recycling, tackling waste and litter plus ways we can look after our local environment. We will then use a variety of literary techniques to convey our message, including poetry and posters. We will also be focussing on instructional writing.
- Handwriting - we will continue to learn the correct formation of letters. It is very important that the letters are formed correctly for when joining is introduced. If you see your child holding a pencil incorrectly at home, please correct it as it makes writing easier.
