Last week we celebrated **Book Week Scotland**, and the whole school enjoyed a wonderful variety of activities. Our Pupil Council took a leading role by designing engaging tasks for classes, including an exciting book hunt that had pupils exploring every corner of the school.

Children from P1-P3, along with their parents and carers, took part in a fantastic activity afternoon, where teachers hosted six different reading-inspired stations. As part of the national initiative, our P2 and P3 pupils were also delighted to receive their Read, Write and Count bags to support literacy and numeracy at home.

A highlight of the week was when our **Primary 6 pupils** visited Glenfield Nursery to share stories with the younger children — a special experience that both groups thoroughly enjoyed. Book Week Scotland was a great success, celebrating reading, creativity, and community across the school.

Our children have been enjoying visits to **Glenburn library** this term. Pupils have explored a wide range of fiction and non-fiction books, and learned how to use the library's borrowing system. The librarians have been extremely welcoming and supportive, helping to spark our learners' curiosity and love of reading. These visits have not only strengthened pupils' literacy skills but have also encouraged them to become confident, independent library users. REMINDER - Swimming lessons for Primary 6 start this Thursday. Children should come prepared with their swimming clothes, a towel and £1 for a locker.

As part of our **Right's Respecting School** journey, our Prefects worked together to gather views from across the school community to create a School Charter. From their research, they settled on the following 4 articles

- Article 12 Every child has the right to have a say in all matters affecting them, and to have their views taken seriously.
- Article 16 Every child has the right to privacy. The law should protect the child's private, family and home
 life.
- Article 28 Every child has the right to an education. Primary education must be free. Secondary education
 must be available for every child. Discipline in schools must respect children's dignity. Richer countries must
 help poorer countries achieve this.
- Article 29 Education must develop every child's personality, talents and abilities to the full. It must encourage the child's respect for human rights, as well as respect for their parents, their own and other cultures, and the environment.

We would love it if you could talk about these rights at home with your child/ren and support us on our journey towards our Gold Award.

Attendance check - Our bi-monthly checks will take place next week. As per Renfrewshire Council policy, if a child's attendance rate falls below 90% you will receive a letter via email. In addition to this, anyone with more than 15 incidents of latecoming will also receive a letter. If there is any way that we, as a school, can support you to improve attendance or latecoming, please contact us.

Absence Policy - We understand that sometimes absence can't be helped. If your child is unwell, please contact the school office **before 9.30am**. Also, if your child has been sick or had diarrhoea, please keep them off for 48 hours, in line with NHS guidance, to avoid spreading it to others.

Latecoming - Thank you for your support with this. We have seen a reduction in latecoming incidents recently and hope that, with your support, we can continue to reduce these. It really does make a huge difference when our pupils are in school on time.

We have several children with **allergies** in the school. With this in mind, we ask for your support to make Langcraigs a nut-free environment, as nuts and products containing nuts can cause severe allergic reactions. Therefore, children should avoid bringing items to school that contain nuts, either for snack or for their lunch. We also discourage the sharing of snacks.
