All zones within our centre naturally flow into one another and play an equal part in a child's development. They provide opportunities for indoor and outdoor experiences allowing children space to further extend their high-quality learning opportunities through play.

Our approach to learning encourages children to become independent decision-makers. Allowing children to make their own decisions empowers them and builds upon their confidence. Our open snack and lunchtime allows children to independently serve their own food and drink and have responsibility for cleaning up after themselves. Children are consistently provided with choice throughout their day to ensure they feel valued and respected.

To support this for our children and their families, we offer flexible placements of 1140 hours of quality early learning & childcare all year-round for children aged 3 years until they start school.
