Nursery Car Park

The safety of our children is of paramount importance. Please be considerate and careful when parking, ensuring you are not blocking pavements or using the disabled bays if you are not a blue badge holder. We appreciate your support with this.

Attendance

During the winter months, colds and infections can be more common. Please keep your child at home if they are unwell.

If your child is going to be absent from nursery, please telephone the nursery before the session starts to inform staff. In the event that no phone call has been received by 9.15 am or 12.45 pm an automated text message will be sent to your mobile asking you to call the nursery giving reasons for absence. We appreciate your support with this as it helps to ensure the safety and well-being of all the children.

Lunch Reminder

If you child has lunch at nursery, could we please remind you to avoid items such as fizzy drinks, nuts, lollipops and boiled sweets in your child's packed lunch box. If giving fruits like grapes or cherries could these be cut in half to reduce the risk of choking. Thank you for your co-operation.

Curriculum

In the snack area the children have had the opportunity to peel and chop a variety of different fruits to prepare snack. They also prepared and cooked potatoes and turnips for Burns Day. The children made soup, chopping, peeling and cutting the vegetables and talking about healthy eating.

Over the past few weeks our role play area has been transformed into a castle and a pirate ship, based on children's ideas in the floorbook. The children have been developing independence skills with the dressing up costumes.

Lots of children enjoyed watching and taking part in some Scottish dancing. We have investigated Scottish customs such as haggis, neeps and tatties, tartan, kilts, bagpipes and Scots rhymes. We have been learning about pattern and created our own tartan designs. We made Scottish flags and learned that Paisley is in Scotland.

Lots of children have shown a particular interest in 'real tools' and have enjoyed using them to practise their fine motor skills by taking apart small electrical items such as a television, at the tinkering table. During block play, children have had lots of opportunities to work as a team and are beginning to point out when good teamwork has taken place.

To promote literacy and reading for enjoyment with the majority of our children, we will celebrate World Book Day in nursery on <u>Wednesday 4 March</u>. A ticket will be issued to you nearer the time. (Please note only one ticket per family for parents who may also have children in P1 or P2 or two children at nursery).
