What is Active Start?

- A less formal, more relaxed start to the day's learning
- All children and staff are busy
- It sets the tone of the day and is valued by all
- It gives the staff time to observe and to interact
- It enables time to give one to one support to children
- Staff have time to talk and to listen
- Children are engaged in a variety of activities
- Children have choices
- Children can consolidate and experiment
- Children can build and develop relationships

How is an Active Start class area organised?

- It contains a variety of activities that consolidate and extend learning
- Activities can be revised as a starting point for future learning
- Children make choices
- Children can work alone, in pairs or small groups
- Self registration takes place to allow children a prompt start to activities
- Staff interaction with, and observation of children is a vital part of the process

Active Start is essentially all of the above with the addition of parents in the process.

- It shows the child a link between home and school and that the link is valued by all
- It can give the child an opportunity to explain and share
- It can give parents ideas on how to support their child's learning at home.

Your role during Active Start

- To enter via the class entrance
- To sign the register in your child's class
- To interact and share the learning with your child
- You will not be asked to do anything that may make you feel uncomfortable
- You are coming into your child's environment so you will experience rules devised by the children
- This is an informal occasion – your parent/teacher interviews will be held throughout the year to discuss your child's progress
