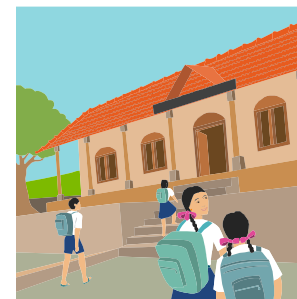

Active Schools Programme (extra-curricular activities)

Active Schools Co-ordinator, Mr Dougie Armour, works across a group of schools throughout the session organising extra-curricular activities for pupils. He issues letters about specific opportunities to pupils in appropriate stages and, depending on the number of spaces available, places are offered to pupils. Parents are asked to note the information contained in the letters sent home by Mr Armour. Mr Armour is responsible for the coaching staff and for all arrangements pertaining to the various activities. Coaching staff have responsibility for the pupils who attend a particular activity.

School Holidays

The school will be closed on Friday 25 September and Monday 28 September for the holiday weekend. As Friday 9th October is an in-service day for staff the children will stop for their October break on Thursday 8 October at 3.00pm, School will re-open on Monday 19 October. Please note that Thursday 8 October is a non-uniform day for pupils, with the usual donation of £1 per child or £2 per family

Travel Arrangements

Parents must ensure that prior to leaving the house in the morning children always know their travel arrangements for the end of each day. We would kindly ask parents to refrain from telephoning the school asking for messages to be relayed to individual children as it is not always possible for these to be passed on. At the end of the day any child who has not been collected should make his/her way to the school office and this is where parents will find them. Please regularly remind your child of this procedure.
